## **SENATE BILL NO. 298**

March 24, 2021, Introduced by Senators MCBROOM, LASATA, HORN, THEIS, STAMAS, ZORN, BARRETT and VANDERWALL and referred to the Committee on Elections.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled

"Michigan election law,"

by amending sections 201, 581, 822, and 842 (MCL 168.201, 168.581, 168.822, and 168.842), section 822 as amended by 2018 PA 614 and section 842 as amended by 2018 PA 382.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 201. The board of county canvassers shall determine which
candidates for the offices named in section 191 of this act

3 received the greatest number of votes and shall declare such those

4 candidates to be duly elected. The said board of county canvassers

1 shall forthwith immediately make and subscribe on its statement of 2 returns a certificate of such determination and deliver same that 3 certificate to the county clerk within 14-21 days following the 4 date of the election.

5 Sec. 581. (1) The returns of said a primary election shall 6 must be canvassed and the results declared in the same manner and 7 within the same time after the primary election and by the same 8 9 case of For a primary election for the nomination of a candidate 10 for the office of United States senator, or Senator, governor, or 11 for the nomination of candidates for district offices in districts comprising more than 1 county, the county clerk of each county 12 13 affected shall transmit to the secretary of state, within 14-21 14 days after the primary election, a certified statement of the 15 number of votes received by each person individual for nomination as a candidate of any political party for any of the said offices. 16

17 (2) The secretary of state shall call a meeting of the board 18 of state canvassers at his **or her** office not later than 20-22 days 19 after the primary election. - which date he The secretary of state 20 shall forthwith immediately certify the date of the meeting to the 21 chairman chairperson and secretary of the state central committee 22 of each political party  $\overline{}$  for the purpose of canvassing the returns 23 and declaring the results of the primary election for the nomination of the candidates for such those offices. 24

(3) The said board of state canvassers shall proceed in the same manner in canvassing the returns and in certifying, recording and determining results of a primary election for the nomination of candidates for United States senator Senator and governor as is done in canvassing the returns in the case of the election of state

2 (4) In canvassing the returns of a primary election for the nomination of candidates for the offices of representative 3 Representative in congress, Congress, state senator, and 4 5 representatives in the legislature, in districts composed of more 6 than 1 county, said the board of state canvassers shall proceed in 7 like the same manner as is done in canvassing the returns in case 8 of for the election of representatives Representatives in 9 congress.Congress.

10 Sec. 822. (1) The board of county canvassers shall then 11 proceed without delay to canvass the returns of votes cast for all 12 candidates for offices voted for and all questions voted on at the election, according to the precinct returns filed with the probate 13 14 judge or presiding probate judge by the several city and township 15 clerks, or in case of for local elections according to the precinct 16 returns filed with the county clerk, and must conclude the canvass 17 at the earliest possible time and in every case no later than the 18 fourteenth twenty-first day after the election.

(2) If the board of county canvassers fails to certify the 19 20 results of any election for any officer or proposition by the 21 fourteenth twenty-first day after the election as provided, the board of county canvassers shall immediately deliver to the 22 23 secretary of the board of state canvassers all records and other 24 information pertaining to the election. The board of state 25 canvassers shall meet immediately and make the necessary determinations and certify the results within the 10 days 26 27 immediately following the receipt of the records from the board of county canvassers. The cost of the canvass must be borne by the 28 29 county involved.

Sec. 842. (1) The board of state canvassers, for the purpose 1 of canvassing the returns and ascertaining and determining the 2 result of an election, shall meet at the office of the secretary of 3 state on or before the twentieth twenty-second day after the 4 election. The secretary of state shall appoint the day of the 5 6 meeting and shall notify the other members of the board. The board 7 has **the** power to adjourn from time to time to await the receipt or 8 correction of returns, or for other necessary purposes, but shall 9 complete the canvass and announce their determination not later 10 than the fortieth day after the election. The board may at the time 11 of its meeting, or an adjournment of its meeting, canvass the 12 returns for any office for which the complete returns have been 13 received.

14 (2) If the unofficial election returns show that the election 15 of electors of President and Vice President of the United States is 16 determined by a vote differential between the first place and second place candidates for President and Vice President of the 17 18 United States of less than 25,000 votes, the secretary of state 19 shall direct the boards of county canvassers to canvass returns for electors of President and Vice President of the United States on an 20 21 expedited schedule. The secretary of state may direct the boards of 22 county canvassers to complete the statements for electors of 23 President and Vice President of the United States required by 24 section 824 and certify the statements as required by section 828 25 to the secretary of state by the seventh day after the election or by a date before the fourteenth twenty-first day after the 26 27 election.

28 (3) The secretary of state may appoint the day for the board29 of state canvassers to conduct the expedited canvass of the returns

for electors of President and Vice President of the United States and determine the results of that election. The day appointed for the expedited canvass must be as soon as practicable after receipt of the returns from the boards of county canvassers, but no later than the twentieth-twenty-second day after the election.
