ORDER TAKING CASES UNDER ADVISEMENT

After presenting testimony for more than two weeks and filing several depositions and thousands of pages of exhibits, the parties have now submitted their last post-trial briefs around 11:52 P.M. (ET) on February 26, 2022. This Court has roughly 1,224 pages of new briefing and attachments to consider along with the evidence presented in the consolidated trial, 3,632-page trial transcript, and the several thousand pages of exhibits and deposition testimony. Given the parties'

thorough treatment of the issues in their written closing arguments, oral argument is no longer necessary. Accordingly, the Clerk is directed to **cancel** the hearing for oral argument on Monday, March 7, 2022.

This Court is taking the consolidated cases under advisement and will prepare a final order as soon as possible—keeping in mind the voluminous record, the importance of the issues presented in these cases to the parties and to the public, and the notion that in this case, as in other election cases, time is of the essence. Now this Court will tackle the multitude of issues in the same way—indeed, the only way—one eats an elephant: one bite at a time.
