**HUNTER PLAINTIFFS' STATEMENT IN OPPOSITION TO DISMISSAL**

On March 4, 2022, this Court directed parties to provide their positions on whether this case should be dismissed in light of the state court's adoption of districting maps. ECF 119. Lisa Hunter, Jacob Zabel, Jennifer Oh, John Persa, Geraldine Schertz, and Kathleen Qualheim (the "Hunter Plaintiffs") recommend against dismissal while motions to stay the implementation of the state court's maps remain pending before the Supreme Court of Wisconsin and the U.S. Supreme Court. If the state court's remedial maps are stayed, the Hunter Plaintiffs' malapportionment injuries will remain unredressed. In that scenario, the obligation to ensure constitutional maps are timely adopted may fall to this Court. The Hunter Plaintiffs join the additional reasons and arguments presented in today's filing by the BLOC Plaintiffs, including the recommendation that a further status update be provided two weeks from today's date.
