INTERVENORS-PETITIONERS LISA HUNTER, JACOB ZABEL, AND JOHN PERSA'S MOTION FOR RELIEF FROM JUDGMENT

Pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes § 806.07(1)(g) and (h), Intervenors-Petitioners Lisa Hunter, Jacob Zabel, and John Persa (the "Hunter Intervenors-Petitioners") respectfully move the Court for relief from its March 3, 2022, decision and judgment (the "Johnson II" decision) adopting a congressional map as an impasse remedy.¹ That decision and judgment were based upon the Court's November 30, 2021, determination ("Johnson I") that the parties' redistricting plans would be evaluated using the "least change" standard. On December 22, 2023, this Court "overrule[d] any portions of Johnson I, Johnson II, and Johnson III that mandate a least change approach." Clarke v. Wis. Elections Comm'n, 2023 WI 79, ¶¶ 61–63. The Court denied reconsideration of that decision on January 11, 2024. Order re: Motion for Reconsideration, Clarke v. Wis. Elections Comm'n, No. 2023AP1399-OA (Jan. 11, 2024).

Relief from the *Johnson II* judgment is warranted in light of *Clarke*. The *Johnson II* congressional map's "prospective application" to control Wisconsin's congressional elections for the

balance of the decade is "no longer equitable," Wis. Stat. \$ 806.07(1)(g), and relief is also justified for several "other reasons," *id.* \$ (h). Accordingly, on the grounds set forth in more detail in the accompanying memorandum, the Court should:

- Grant the Hunter Intervenors-Petitioners relief from the Johnson II judgment imposing Wisconsin's current congressional map as a prospective impasse remedy;
- (2) Permit the parties to submit remedial congressional plans that satisfy Wisconsin's judicial redistricting criteria for congressional maps as clarified by *Clarke*; and
- (3) Adopt a plan satisfying those criteria as Wisconsin's congressional map for the remainder of the decade as soon as practicable, and in time for the 2024 congressional elections.
