## DEMOCRATIC PARTY OF ILLINOIS'S OPPOSED MOTION TO PARTICIPATE IN ARGUMENT AS AMICUS CURIAE

The Democratic Party of Illinois ("DPF") hereby moves for leave to participate as amicus curiae in the oral argument on Defendants' motion to dismiss scheduled for December 7, 2022 in the above-captioned matter.

Plaintiffs have previously consented to DPI's participation in this matter as amicus curiae. *See* Pls. Mem. in Opp'n to DPI's Mot. to Intervene, Dkt. 27 at 2. In its October 11 Memorandum Opinion and Order denying DPI's motion to intervene, Dkt. 56, the Court granted DPI leave to designate its already-filed substantive memoranda as those of an amicus curiae in support of Defendants' Motion to Dismiss. On October 12, DPI asked the court to consider the arguments set forth in its Proposed Motion to Dismiss, Dkt. 13-1, and Proposed Memorandum in Opposition to Plaintiffs' Motion for Partial Summary Judgment, ECF No. 44, as those of an amicus curiae. On November 7, 2022, the Court indicated in a minute entry that "the decisional process for [Defendants' motion to dismiss] would be aided by oral argument," and accordingly scheduled

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oral argument for December 5, 2022. The argument was rescheduled for December 7, 2022 by agreement of the parties.

DPI believes that its participation as *amicus* in the December 7 argument would materially aid the Court's resolution of Defendants' motion to dismiss. Whether to grant leave to participate as amicus is within the discretion of the district court. *Chamberlain Grp., Inc. v. Interlogix, Inc.,* No. 01 C 6157, 2004 WL 1197258, at \*2 (N.D. Ill. May 28, 2004). "Leave to appear *amicus curiae* has been granted where it may be useful or otherwise desirable to the Court." *Adams v. City of Chicago*, No. 94 C 5727, 1995 WL 491496, at \*1 (Aug. 11, 1995); *see also U.S. v. Bd. of Educ. of City of Chi.,* 663 F. Supp. 2d 649, 661 (N.D. Ill. 2009) (welcoming participation of amici that "contributed to the clarity of the issues"); *Chamberlain Grp.,* 2004 WL 1197258, at \*1 (permitting filing of amicus brief where amicus identified and analyzed additional relevant authority).

Accordingly, DPI respectfully requests the Court grant it leave to appear and present argument as amicus curiae at the December 7 argument in this matter.

DPI asked the parties for their position on this motion. Plaintiffs oppose this motion and Defendants take no position.
