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## **MOTION TO TRANSFER**

Plaintiff Poder Latinx ("Plaintiff" or "Poder Latinx") respectfully moves this Court
to transfer *Poder Latinx v. Hobbs*, Case No. 22-cv-1003-MTL, to the Honorable Judge Susan
R. Bolton pursuant Local Rule 42.1, because it is related to the consolidated actions, *Mi Familia Vota v. Hobbs*, 2:22-cv-509-SRB, and *Living United for Change in Arizona v. Hobbs*, 2:22-cv-519-SRB. All three cases concern overlapping challenges to the same
recently enacted Arizona election law, 2022 Ariz. Sess. Laws, ch. 99, or House Bill 2492
("HB 2492").

On April 13, 2022, the Honorable Chief Judge G. Murray Snow ordered the transfer
of *Mi Familia Vota v. Hobbs*, 2:22-cv-509, to the Honorable Judge Susan R. Bolton, who
had been assigned *Living United for Change in Arizona v. Hobbs*, 2:22-cv-519, because the
two cases "challenge[] the same statute on substantially similar grounds." 22-cv-509-SRB,
Dkt. 7, at 2. On May 17, 2022, the Honorable Judge Susan R. Bolton ordered the
consolidation of those two cases. 22-cv-509-SRB, Dkt. 39.

Local Rule 42.1(a) provides that "[w]hen two or more cases are pending before different Judges, a party in any of those cases may file a motion to transfer the case or cases to a single Judge on the ground that the cases: (1) arise from substantially the same transaction or event; (2) involve substantially the same parties or property; . . . (4) call for determination of substantially the same questions of law; or (5) for any other reason would entail substantial duplication of labor if heard by different Judges."

*Poder Latinx v. Hobbs*, Case No. 22-cv-1003-MTL, is substantially similar to the
other two challenges. It challenges the same law and is filed against the same parties.
Arizona Secretary of State Katie Hobbs has been named as a defendant in all three lawsuits;
Attorney General Mark Brnovich and Maricopa County Recorder Stephen Richer have been
named as defendants in *Poder Latinx* and *Mi Famila Vota*. All three cases will necessitate
the adjudication of substantially similar factual and legal questions. Additionally, there will
be significant overlap regarding discovery and briefing in the three related cases. Transfer

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of this related case is appropriate to avoid both the substantial duplication of labor and the risk of inconsistent rulings on the same factual and legal questions.

Accordingly, Plaintiff respectfully requests that this case be transferred to the Honorable Judge Susan R. Bolton, for adjudication with *Mi Familia Vota v. Hobbs*, 2:22-cv-509-SRB, and *Living United for Change in Arizona v. Hobbs*, 2:22-cv-519-SRB.

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
