VERIFIED COMPLAINT

Plaintiffs, **Willie Wilson, Robert Fioretti, Earl C. Williams, Eugene Wolf, Nina Stoner, Minor J. Allen Jr., Geraldine Young, and Francisco Rodriguez,** through their attorney, file their verified complaint respectfully requesting entry of a declaratory judgment and other relief pursuant to 42 U.S.C. §1983 against Defendants, **City of Chicago Board of Election Commissioners, and Marisel A. Hernandez, Chair, and William J. Kresse, Commissioner, and June A. Brown, Commissioner, each in their official capacities as Commissioners of the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners.**

Nature of the Case

1. This is an action for a declaratory and injunctive relief, seeking to enjoin the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners from changing precinct boundaries mid-election cycle, and less than 30 days prior to the November 8,

2022 general election, without sufficient impact assessment upon African-American, Latino, Native American, and Asian voters, with at least 90 days prior notice provided to all voters in Chicago. Defendants are state actors that comprise the election authority for the City of Chicago that is embarking upon a process to remove at least 779 precincts and a considerable number of polling locations in Chicago. The change made on the eve of the November 8, 2022, and after petitioning would have commenced for the February 28, 2023 municipal general election and April 4, 2023 municipal runoff election would disenfranchise voter, create voter confusion on election day, deny to Plaintiffs and other voters their First Amendment rights of association and of ballot access, and their Fourteenth Amendment right to equal protection under the law.

Parties

2. Plaintiff, Dr. Willie Wilson, is a registered voter in Chicago who resides in the 42nd Ward of the City of Chicago, IL and is a candidate for Chicago Mayor at the February 28, 2023 Chicago municipal general election. Plaintiff, Dr. Wilson, is deeply concerned about the uncertainty, voter confusion, and the potential denial of the right to vote arising from the proposed reduction of precincts, polling locations, and election judges that would certainly limit voter access at the upcoming general election and subsequent municipal election, and deny First Amendment ballot access rights to tens of thousands of Chicago voters.

3. Plaintiff, Robert Fioretti, is a registered voter in Chicago who resides in the remapped 34th Ward of the City of Chicago and is a candidate for Cook County Board President at the November 8, 2022 general election. Plaintiff, Robert Fioretti, is a former Alderperson of the City of Chicago, and is concerned about the

reduction of precincts, polling locations, and voter access at the upcoming general election, particularly since the redistricting information will not be available until shortly before the November 8, 2022 general election, which hampers, delays, and prevents his campaign from developing election-day canvassing strategies, including scheduling volunteers at polling locations, and contacting voters who previously voted at specific polling locations (“GOTV” efforts).

4. Plaintiff, Earl C. Williams is a registered voter in Chicago and resides in the 3rd Ward of the City of Chicago, IL.

5. Plaintiff, Eugene Wolf, is a registered voter in Chicago and resides in the 27th Ward of the City of Chicago.

6. Plaintiff, Nina Stoner is a registered voter in Chicago and resides in the currently remapped 21st Ward, but was previously in the 34th Ward of the City of Chicago.

7. Plaintiff, Minor J. Allen, Jr. is a registered voter in Chicago and resides in the 17th Ward of the City of Chicago.

8. Plaintiff, Geraldine Young, is a registered voter in Chicago and resides in the 28th Ward of the City of Chicago.

9. Plaintiff, Francisco Rodriguez, is a registered voter in Chicago and resides in the 11th Ward of the City of Chicago.

10. Defendant, Marisel A. Hernandez, serves in her official capacity as one of three appointed Commissioners of the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners, and is the Chair of the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners.

11. Defendant, William J. Kresse, serves in his official capacity as one of three appointed Commissioners of the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners, and is the Secretary of the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners.

12. Defendant, June A. Brown, serves in her official capacity as one of three appointed Commissioners of the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners, and is the Secretary of the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners.

13. Defendant, Chicago Board of Election Commissioners (“CBEC”), is a unit of the City of Chicago¹, a municipal corporation, and is the duly authorized election authority for the City of Chicago that oversees and administers elections within the geographic boundaries of the City of Chicago, IL, including but not limited to primary and general elections in even numbered years, and Chicago municipal general elections and runoff elections every four years the next of which will occur in the year 2023.

14. At all times relevant to this action, Defendants are and were engaged in state action under color of state law.

15. Defendants are being sued in their official capacities for declaratory and injunctive relief under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and 28 U.S.C. § 2201, as well as for costs and attorney’s fees under 42 U.S.C. § 1988(b).

The Chicago Board of Election Commissioners received an appropriation of \$25,828,604 in the 2022 budget (at Annual Budget, pg. 19). *Id.*

Jurisdiction

16. Jurisdiction in this case is predicated on 28 U.S.C. § 1331, 1343(a)(3), 1343(a)(4), and 1357, this being a case arising under the Constitution of the United States and 42 U.S.C. § 1983 and 1988, and a claim under the federal Declaratory Judgment Act (28 U.S.C. §§ 2201, 2202).

Venue

17. Venue is proper in this District under 28 U.S.C. 1391(b) because a substantial part of the events giving rise to Plaintiffs' claims occurred in Cook County, IL, and within the Northern District of Illinois.

Relevant Facts + Election Code

18. Article 11 of the Illinois Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/11-1, et seq. defines the "Establishment of Election Precincts," as most recently amended by P.A. 102-668 (eff. 11/15/2021). Please see 10 ILCS 5/11-1, et seq. and P.A. 102-668, attached as **Exhibit A**.

19. The CBEC website as of August 28, 2022, lists the same 2,069 precincts with 1,043 polling locations at which voters voted in the June 28, 2022 partisan primary elections at which established political parties selected their candidates for the November 8, 2022 general election. The CBEC website for ward polling locations is as follows:

20. The CBEC anticipates disclosing new precinct boundaries and addresses for new polling locations in October 2022.

21. The CBEC public disclosure of new precinct boundaries and new addresses for polling locations will be less than 30 days prior to the November 8, 2022 general election.

22. The CBEC has stated that it will eliminate 779 precincts in Chicago with reduction of 40-50% in many wards. Please see summary of existing precinct in each ward, and CBEC proposed number of precincts, attached as Exhibit C.

23. The CBEC's proposed reduction of precincts will disparately impact racial and/or ethnic minority voting blocs including African-American, Latino, Native American, and Asian voters, including but not limited hundreds of precincts within the territory of the 3rd, 8th, 9th, 14th, 17th, 18th, 21st Wards, and the former 34th Ward, resulting in a dilution of the corresponding voting blocs representation at elections.

24. The Election Code 10 ILCS 5/11-4 delegates to the CBEC the duty of designating "the polling place in each precinct in such city, village or incorporated town which has adopted or is operating under said Article 6, and to give public notice thereof, and shall cause the same to be fitted up, warmed, lighted and cleaned, but in each election precinct and in each area for which a registration place is designated such place or places shall be in the most public, orderly and convenient portions thereof, and no building or part of a building shall be designated or used as a place of registry, or revision of registration, or as a polling place, in which spirituous or intoxicating liquor is sold."

25. There is no Legislatively defined procedure, or Legislatively defined data or demographic information that the CBEC should use to determine precinct boundaries or addresses of polling locations.

26. The CBEC procedure to define precinct boundaries and polling locations is undertaken by the CBEC without public comment or public review.

27. The CBEC's precinct boundaries and addresses of polling locations are not subject to review and approval by the City of Chicago City Council.

28. The only criteria defined by the Legislature for the CBEC to determine boundaries for precincts is contained in the Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/11-1, et seq., including but not limited to 10 ILCS 5/11-3.

29. For the City of Chicago precinct size as defined in 10 ILCS 5/11-3(c) was amended through P.A. 102-668 (eff. 11-15-21) to increase the precinct from "400 actual voters" to "1,800 registered voters if the precinct is located in a county with 3,000,000 or more inhabitants" as follows:

(c) Within 90 days after each presidential election, a board in a city with more than 500,000 inhabitants shall revise and rearrange such precincts on the basis of the votes cast at such election, making such precincts to contain, as near as practicable: (i) 1,200 registered voters if the precinct is located in a county with fewer than 3,000,000 inhabitants; or (ii) 1,800 registered voters if the precinct is located in a county with 3,000,000 or more inhabitants. However, any apartment building in which more than 1,200 registered voters or 1,800 registered voters, as applicable, reside may be made a single precinct even though the vote in such precinct exceeds 1,200 or 1,800 registered voters, as applicable.

30. The Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/11-3(c) anticipates that precincts shall be revised and rearranged ***after*** the presidential election, and therefore, would allow election authorities almost two years ***prior*** to the next general election to notify voters of such changed precinct boundaries and new polling locations.

31. Section 11-6 of the Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/11-6, further defined additional requirements, including a requirement that the CBEC is obligated to disclose precinct boundaries **at least 90 days** before the next scheduled election, as follows:

Sec. 11-6. Within 60 days after July 1, 2014 (the effective date of Public Act 98-691), each election authority shall transmit to the principal office of the State Board of Elections and publish on any website maintained by the election authority maps in electronic portable document format (PDF) showing the current boundaries of all the precincts within its jurisdiction. **Whenever election precincts in an election jurisdiction have been redivided or readjusted**, the county board or board of election commissioners shall prepare maps in electronic portable document format (PDF) showing such election precinct boundaries **no later than 90 days before the next scheduled election**. The maps shall show the boundaries of all political subdivisions and districts. The county board or board of election commissioners shall immediately forward copies thereof to the chair of each county central committee in the county, to each township, ward, or precinct committeeperson, and each local election official whose political subdivision is wholly or partly in the county and, upon request, shall furnish copies thereof to each candidate for political or public office in the county and shall transmit copies thereof to the principal office of the State Board of Elections and publish copies thereof on any website maintained by the election authority. (*Source: P.A. 99-642, eff. 7-28-16; 100-1027, eff. 1-1-19.*)

32. As of August 27, 2022 the CBEC has not prepared “maps in electronic portable document format (PDF) showing such election precinct boundaries” in compliance with 10 ILCS 5/11-6 since there are fewer than 90 days before the November 8, 2022 general election, and is in violation of the disclosure obligation.

33. All polling locations must be accessible to persons with disabilities pursuant to Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended (“ADA”), 42 U.S.C. §§ 12131-12134, and the Department of Justice’s Title-II-implementing regulation, 28 C.F.R. Part 35, as well as accessible to voters with disabilities and additionally to elderly voters, pursuant to 10 ILCS 5/11-4.2(a) which states as follows:

Sec. 11-4.2. (a) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (b) all polling places shall be accessible to voters with disabilities and elderly voters, as determined by rule of the State Board of Elections, and each polling place shall include at least one voting booth that is wheelchair accessible.

34. The majority of CBEC’s polling locations have not been accessible and in compliance with accessibility requirements since at least 2017, when the Dept. of

Justice initiated litigation against the CBEC for its lack of compliance, as documented by a settlement agreement reached with the Dept. of Justice. Please see press release from CBEC and Settlement Agreement, attached as Exhibit D.

35. At the June 28, 2022 primary election 206 polling locations were accessible to persons with disabilities of 1,043 locations. Please see Exhibit B.

36. The CBEC has extended and stayed implementation of its statutory obligation to provide accessible voting locations through at least June 28, 2022, and despite a settlement agreement with the Dept. of Justice.

37. After the 2010 decennial redistricting, the City of Chicago adopted its ward redistricting ordinance on January 19, 2012, however, through ordinance adopted by the City Council the application and use of the adopted 2012 ward remap was stayed until 2015.

38. On information and belief, the CBEC did not redistrict precinct boundaries and identify polling locations until after the January 19, 2012 ward redistricting maps went into effect in 2015.

39. Gerrymandering is a valid and decennial concern that is well-known throughout the State and particularly in Chicago (see e.g. remapped wards not contiguous and compact); gerrymandering remains an even greater concern for redistricting of the precinct boundaries and designation of polling locations because the CBEC does not use or rely upon demographic data. On information and belief, the CBEC has given preferential treatment to Ward 19 at the request of Ald. Matt O'Shea whose ward was scheduled for a 50% reduction in precincts from 57 to 28 precincts, but at his request, the CBEC increased the precincts in Ward 19 to 26 precincts, because Ald. O'Shea was concerned the decrease would limit voter

access. Please see Chicago Tribune article “New Chicago elections map cutting precincts significantly ahead of November general election” by Kinsey Crowley² (Aug 22, 2022 at 5:00 am) copy attached hereto as **Exhibit E**.

40. Plaintiffs are voters in Chicago who wish to preserve and exercise their right to vote in person on a paper ballot at the November 8, 2022, and to effectively canvass voters and campaign at in-person polling locations on election day.

41. Plaintiffs are unable to determine their precincts and their polling locations as of the date of filing of this lawsuit, and will be unable to meaningfully prepare for the campaign activities on election day if new precinct boundaries and new polling locations are disclosed less than 30 days before the November 8, 2022 general election at some time in October 2022.

42. In *Eu v. San Francisco County Democratic Central Comm.*, 489 US 214, 223 (1989) the U.S. Supreme Court confirmed that First Amendment protections are applicable to political party speech as follows:

Indeed, the First Amendment “has its fullest and most urgent application” to speech uttered during a campaign for political office. *Monitor Patriot Co. v. Roy*, 401 U. S. 265, 272 (1971); see also *Mills v. Alabama*, 384 U. S. 214, 218 (1966). Free discussion about candidates for public office is no less critical before a primary than before a general election. Cf. *Storer v. Brown*, 415 U. S. 724, 735 (1974); *Smith v. Allwright*, 321 U. S. 649, 666 (1944); *United States v. Classic*, 313 U. S. 299, 314 (1941). In both instances, the “election campaign is a means of disseminating ideas as well as attaining political office.” *Illinois Bd. of Elections*, *supra*, at 186.

43. Plaintiffs wish to exercise their First Amendment right to organize and support the candidates of their choice at the November 8, 2022 general election by

greeting voters at polling locations on election day, November 8, 2022, handing out literature to voters outside of polling locations, and promoting their candidates to voters who are voting in-person at polling locations on election day.

44. Plaintiffs, and other voters and candidates, are unable to coordinate, staff, and plan election day campaign activities at polling locations without having precinct boundaries and polling locations in sufficient time prior to the November 8, 2022 election; in addition, Plaintiffs and other voters and candidates are not able to obtain voter data from the CBEC for voters in that precinct and specific polling location, and voter turnout from prior elections.

45. Plaintiffs are also being denied their right to obtain maps of precinct boundaries in each of the 50 wards, and prevented from developing and preparing campaign strategies at polling locations on election day November 8, 2022.

46. Plaintiffs Willie Wilson, Earl C. Williams, Eugene Wolf, Nina Stoner, Minor J. Allen Jr, and Geraldine Young are African-American voters, Plaintiff, Robert Fioretti is a Caucasian voter, Plaintiff, Francisco Rodriguez is a Latino voter, and all other similarly situated voters, are collectively being disenfranchised and discriminated against, as compared to voters in counties of less than 3,000,000 inhabitants, through the uncertainty of their precinct and their polling location, and also very likely not being timely notified of their new polling location, having to travel a greater distance to reach their polling location, and having to wait in longer lines to exercise their right to cast a paper ballot in person on election day November 8, 2022, thereby jeopardizing their right to cast a paper ballot on election at their polling location.

47. It is inequitable and inconsistent with prior Legislative action and actions of the City of Chicago, that sought to avoid implementing changes mid-election cycle or immediately prior to an election; that is, it is inequitable to change precinct boundaries and polling locations after the June 28, 2022 primary election and before the November 8, 2022 general election, since voters will remember their former precincts and former polling locations, and may not become aware of new precincts or polling locations, risking considerable voter confusion on election day that could jeopardize the integrity of the electoral process and undermine voter confidence in the election.

48. Plaintiffs have been, and continued to be injured, harmed, and denied their First Amendment and Fourteenth Amendment ballot access rights through the CBEC's proposed redistricting of precinct boundaries and reduction of polling locations, including but not limited being unable to determine their precinct and the address of their polling locations in sufficient time to prepare for the November 8, 2022 general election, determining and staffing polling locations for the Nov. 8, 2022 general election to support the candidates of their choice, and uncertainty about where their polling locations will be located; furthermore, it is anticipated that tens of thousands of voters would be required to travel much further distances to reach a polling location and have longer lines and wait times to vote, thereby jeopardizing their right to cast a paper ballot in person on election day.

Count I
Violation of Voting Rights Act of 1965

1-48 Plaintiffs restate Par. 1-48 above as Par. 1-48 of Count I.

49. The Voting Rights Act of 1965, 52 U.S. Code §10101, et seq. prohibits any procedure that adversely impacts and/or results in the denial of the right to vote on account of race.

50. The Voting Rights Act of 1965, 52 U.S. Code § 10301, prohibits any redistricting plan or voting procedure that results in the denial or abridgement of right to vote on account of race or color through voting qualifications or prerequisites, as follows:

§10301. Denial or abridgement of right to vote on account of race or color through voting qualifications or prerequisites; establishment of violation

(a) No voting qualification or prerequisite to voting or standard, practice, or procedure shall be imposed or applied by any State or political subdivision in a manner which results in a denial or abridgement of the right of any citizen of the United States to vote on account of race or color, or in contravention of the guarantees set forth in section 10303(f)(2) of this title, as provided in subsection (b).

(b) A violation of subsection (a) is established if, based on the totality of circumstances, it is shown that the political processes leading to nomination or election in the State or political subdivision are not equally open to participation by members of a class of citizens protected by subsection (a) in that its members have less opportunity than other members of the electorate to participate in the political process and to elect representatives of their choice. The extent to which members of a protected class have been elected to office in the State or political subdivision is one circumstance which may be considered: Provided, That nothing in this section establishes a right to have members of a protected class elected in numbers equal to their proportion in the population.

(*Pub. L. 89–110, title I, §2, Aug. 6, 1965, 79 Stat. 437 ; renumbered title I, Pub. L. 91–285, §2, June 22, 1970, 84 Stat. 314 ; amended Pub. L. 94–73, title II, §206, Aug. 6, 1975, 89 Stat. 402 ; Pub. L. 97–205, §3, June 29, 1982, 96 Stat. 134 .*)

51. For purposes of redistricting, if a redistricting plan results in a maximum population deviation of less than 10%, the plan nonetheless violates the

Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment if the redistricting process contains the “taint of arbitrariness or discrimination.” See *Roman v. Sincock*, 377 U.S. 369, 710 (1964). If the redistricting process was either arbitrary or discriminatory, then the resulting redistricting plan is unconstitutional and therefore void *ab initio*.

52. The CBEC does not use population data from the U.S. Census for its redistricting of precinct boundaries or the determination of polling locations.

53. The CBEC did not obtain or consider demographic data, including race, national origin, age, or data for the number of voters with disabilities, prior to undertaking the redistricting of precinct boundaries and polling locations.

54. The CBEC did not study the impact its reduction of precincts would have upon African-American voters in Chicago.

55. The CBEC did not consider that a significant decrease in the number of precincts in largely African-American wards in Chicago would limit voter access, and thereby create inequity.

56. The CBEC process of redistricting of precinct boundaries and selection of polling locations is arbitrary and discriminatory, since it does not address the inequity that will result in largely African-American wards in Chicago.

57. The US Postal Service in Chicago has been suffering from delays, misdelivered mail, lost mail, and other concerns that have been publicly expressed in recent years through the present.

58. Through the proclamation of results for the June 28, 2022 primary election, the CBEC reported that the City of Chicago had 1,498,813 registered voters.

59. In order to notify each registered voter in Chicago about the CBEC's new precinct boundaries and new polling locations, on information and belief, the CBEC would need undertake the following steps in less than 30 days:

(a) re-program the CBEC voter database for new precinct boundaries and polling locations,

(b) audit and verify the accuracy of the new precinct and polling location information,

(c) prepare and approve a Notice in multiple languages that would adequately notify each voter about each voter's new precinct and new polling location,

(d) generate and print a customized notice to each of Chicago's 1,498,813 registered voters advising each voter of his/her own precinct and polling location,

(e) arrange for and transport at least 1,498,813 paper notices to the US Postal Service with a sufficient time in advance of the November 8, 2022 general election to allow the US Postal Service to process, sort, and deliver each notice prior to election day.

60. There is potentially a one or two week window of time in October 2022 for the CBEC to complete all of the steps to notify Chicago's 1,498,813 through the US Postal Service mail system, which is a mandatory requirement of pursuant to Article 11 of the Election Code.

61. On information and belief, the CBEC's staff and resources will not be available to meaningfully and equitably redistrict precinct boundaries and meaningfully and equitably designate polling locations until after the April 4, 2023 municipal runoff election. Specifically, the CBEC's staff is currently preparing for

the November 8, 2022 general election and its staff and resources are already allocated for those tasks. Immediately after the November 8, 2022 general election the CBEC's staff will be allocated to canvass and proclaim the election results of the November 8, 2022 general election while accepting candidate petitions for the February 28, 2023 municipal election during the November 21-28, 2022 filing period, overseeing the petition challenge process throughout December 2022, and actively preparing for the February 28, 2023 municipal election.

62. It is likely and probable that the CBEC will not be able to effectively and actually notify all of Chicago's 1,498,813 voters of their new polling locations through use of the US Postal Service mail service prior to the November 8, 2022 general election.

63. On information and belief, there will be voter confusion through designation of new precinct boundaries and new polling locations, when voters return to the polling locations that were used in recent elections to discover that their polling location was relocated to a different address, and are unable to (a) locate the address of the relocated polling location and/or (b) travel to the relocated polling location prior to closure of the polls at 7:00 PM on November 8, 2022.

64. Plaintiffs respectfully request a finding and determination from this honorable court that the CBEC's implementation of precinct redistricting and designation of polling locations is in violation of the Voting Rights Act since it will disparately and inequitably impact African-American voters in Chicago.

65. Plaintiffs respectfully request an injunction be issued to direct the CBEC to delay implementation of its precinct redistricting and designation of new

polling locations until after the Chicago Municipal Runoff Elections on April 4, 2023.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs respectfully request entry of an order as follows:

(a) finding and declaring that the CBEC's intention and process to redistrict precincts mid-election cycle, and designate new polling locations from those used at the June 28, 2022 primary election are in violation of Article 11 of the Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/11-1, et seq., in violation of the Voting Rights Act, contrary to Plaintiff's First and Fourteenth Amendment rights, and unconstitutional and void *ab initio*;

(b) issuing an injunction to enjoin the CBEC and its employees, agents, and designees, from enforcing or giving any effect to the proposed precinct reduction and redistricting, and the proposed designation of new polling locations until after April 4, 2023 and such time as the CBEC provides data to support an equitable redistricting and polling location designation, that will not disparately impact African-American, Latino, Asian, or other voting blocs in Chicago; and

(c) for any further relief that is just and appropriate.

Count II

Declaratory judgment that CBEC precinct remap as applied is unconstitutional

1-65. Plaintiffs repeat and restate Par. 1-65 above as if fully stated herein.

66. The CBEC's proposed procedure for redistricting precincts and determining new polling locations are not in compliance with the provisions of Article 11 of the Election Code, and do not afford sufficient time for voters to familiarize themselves with their precincts, determine their new polling locations, prepare for election day canvassing and campaigning, and for the CBEC to

meaningfully and appropriately convey all necessary information to all voters in Chicago through the US Postal Service mail.

67. The CBEC's process for redistricting precinct boundaries as alleged herein are arbitrary and capricious, and will result in denial of the Plaintiff's First Amendment right to petition voters, a denial of their First Amendment right to associate as a political party to nominate Plaintiffs' candidates of their choice, and a denial of their First Amendment right to promote the Libertarian party at the June 28, 2022 primary.

68. A real and actual controversy exists between the parties.

69. Plaintiffs have no adequate remedy at law, other than this action pursuant to 42 U.S.C. § 1983 for declaratory and equitable relief.

70. Plaintiffs are suffering irreparable harm as a result of the violations complained of herein, and that harm will continue unless the CBEC's proposed precinct reduction and redistricting is declared unlawful and enjoined by this honorable Court.

71. A declaration of the Plaintiffs' rights on an expedited basis in advance of the November 8, 2022 general election would provide clarity to voters and candidates, and direction to the CBEC regarding the redistricting process that is not otherwise afforded through the Election Code for an impartial and equitable redistricting of precincts and designation of polling locations.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs, through their attorney, respectfully request entry of a declaratory judgment as follows:

(a) finding and declaring that the CBEC's intention and process to redistrict precincts mid-election cycle, and designate new polling locations from those used

at the June 28, 2022 primary election are in violation of Article 11 of the Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/11-1, et seq., in violation of the Voting Rights Act, contrary to Plaintiff's First and Fourteenth Amendment rights, and unconstitutional and void *ab initio*;

(b) issuing an injunction to enjoin the CBEC and its employees, agents, and designees, from enforcing or giving any effect to the proposed precinct reduction and redistricting, and the proposed designation of new polling locations until after April 4, 2023 and such time as the CBEC provides data to support an equitable redistricting and polling location designation, that will not disparately impact African-American, Latino, Asian, or other voting blocs in Chicago; and

(c) any other relief that is just and equitable to protect Plaintiffs', other voters', and all candidates' First and Fourteenth Amendment rights.

Count III

Denial of First Amendment ballot access rights (42 U.S.C. § 1983)

1-71. Plaintiffs repeat and restate Par. 1-71 above as if fully stated herein.

72. The Supreme Court in *Anderson v. Celebrezze*, 460 U.S. 780, 789, 103 S.Ct. 1564, 1570 (1983), instructed lower courts to “consider the character and magnitude of the asserted injury to the rights protected” by the constitution, to “identify and evaluate the precise interests put forth by the State,” and then to decide whether the interests justify the restriction.

73. The City of Chicago and/or the CBEC have previously delayed implementing ward boundary redistricting, precinct redistricting, and even delayed implementing requirements for accessibility at all polling locations.

74. Staying implementation of the CBEC's proposed precinct redistricting and designation of new polling locations would be equitable and would preserve Plaintiffs' and other voters' First Amendment ballot access rights.

75. Changing precinct boundaries and polling locations mid-election cycle, and not disclosing new precinct boundaries and polling locations less than 30 days before the November 8, 2022 election and relying upon the US Postal Service for delivery of notices to voters weeks or less before the November 8, 2022 general election would violate rights guaranteed to the Plaintiffs by the First Amendment to the United States Constitution, as enforced through 42 U.S.C. § 1983, including but not limited to having a meaningful amount of time to prepare for election day canvassing, and an opportunity to cast a paper ballot in person on election day.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiffs respectfully request that this Court enter judgment as follows:

- (a) Assume original jurisdiction over this case;
- (b) Issue a temporary restraining order and/or preliminary injunction to enjoin the CBEC and its employees, agents, and designees, from enforcing or giving any effect to the proposed precinct reduction and redistricting, and the proposed designation of new polling locations until after April 4, 2023 and such time as the CBEC provides data to support an equitable redistricting and polling location designation, that will not disparately impact African-American, Latino, Asian, or other voting blocs in Chicago;
- (c) Issue a declaratory judgment finding and declaring that the CBEC's intention and process to redistrict precincts mid-election cycle, and designate new

polling locations from those used at the June 28, 2022 primary election are in violation of Article 11 of the Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/11-1, et seq., in violation of the Voting Rights Act, contrary to Plaintiff's First and Fourteenth Amendment rights, and unconstitutional and void *ab initio*;

(d) Issue a permanent injunction against the CBEC to enjoin the CBEC and its employees, agents, and designees, from enforcing or giving any effect to the proposed precinct reduction and redistricting, and the proposed designation of new polling locations until after April 4, 2023 and such time as the CBEC provides data to support an equitable redistricting and polling location designation, that will not disparately impact African-American, Latino, Asian, or other voting blocs in Chicago;

(e) Order Defendants to pay to Plaintiffs their costs and a reasonable attorney's fees under 42 U.S.C. § 1988(b), and

(f) Retain jurisdiction over this matter to enforce this court's order, and

(g) Order the CBEC to provide to Plaintiffs such further and additional relief as the Court deems just, appropriate, and equitable.

Count IV

Denial of Fourteenth Amendment equal protection rights (42 U.S.C. § 1983)

1-75. Plaintiffs repeat and restate Par. 1-75 above as if fully stated herein.

76. Defendants' actions violate rights guaranteed to these Plaintiffs by the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution to equal protection under the law, as enforced through 42 U.S.C. § 1983.

WHEREFORE, the Plaintiffs respectfully request that this Court enter judgment as follows:

(a) Assume original jurisdiction over this case;

(b) Issue a temporary restraining order and/or preliminary injunction to enjoin the CBEC and its employees, agents, and designees, from enforcing or giving any effect to the proposed precinct reduction and redistricting, and the proposed designation of new polling locations until after April 4, 2023 and such time as the CBEC provides data to support an **equitable** redistricting and polling location designations, that will not disparately impact African-American, Latino, Asian, or other voting blocs in Chicago;

(c) Issue a declaratory judgment finding and declaring that the CBEC's intention and process to redistrict precincts mid-election cycle, and designate new polling locations from those used at the June 28, 2022 primary election are in violation of Article 11 of the Election Code, 10 ILCS 5/11-1, et seq., in violation of the Voting Rights Act, contrary to Plaintiff's First and Fourteenth Amendment rights, and unconstitutional and void *ab initio*;

(d) Issue a permanent injunction against the CBEC to enjoin the CBEC and its employees, agents, and designees, from enforcing or giving any effect to the proposed precinct reduction and redistricting, and the proposed designation of new polling locations until after April 4, 2023 and until such time as the CBEC provides data to support an **equitable** redistricting and polling location designations, that will not disparately impact African-American, Latino, Asian, or other voting blocs in Chicago;

(e) Order Defendants to pay to Plaintiffs their costs and a reasonable attorney's fees under 42 U.S.C. § 1988(b); and

(f) Retain jurisdiction over this matter to enforce this court's order, and

(g) Order the CBEC to provide to Plaintiffs such further and additional relief as the Court deems just, appropriate, and equitable.

ARTICLE 11. ESTABLISHMENT OF ELECTION PRECINCTS

(10 ILCS 5/11-1) (from Ch. 46, par. 11-1)

Sec. 11-1. In counties not under township organization, the election precincts shall remain as now established until changed by the Board of County Commissioners, but said County Board may, from time to time, change the boundaries of election precincts and establish new ones. In counties under township organization, each town shall constitute at least one election precinct. Insofar as is practicable, each precinct shall be situated within a single congressional, legislative and representative district and within a single municipal ward. In order to situate each precinct within a single district or ward, the County Board shall change the boundaries of election precincts after each decennial census as soon as is practicable following the completion of congressional and legislative redistricting.

At any consolidated primary or consolidated election at which municipal officers are to be elected, and at any emergency referendum at which a public question relating to a municipality is to be voted on, notwithstanding any other provision of this Code, the election authority shall establish a polling place within such municipality upon the request of the municipal council or board of trustees at least 60 days before the election and provided that the municipality provides a suitable polling place. To accomplish this purpose, the election authority may establish an election precinct constituting a single municipality of under 500 population for all elections, notwithstanding the minimum precinct size otherwise specified herein.

Notwithstanding the above, when there are not more than 50 registered voters in a precinct who are entitled to vote in a local government or school district election, the election authority having jurisdiction over the precinct is authorized to reassign such voters to one or more polling places in adjacent precincts, within or without the election authority's

jurisdiction, for that election. For the purposes of such local government or school district election only, the votes of the reassigned voters shall be tallied and canvassed as votes from the precinct of the polling place to which such voters have been reassigned. The election authority having jurisdiction over the precinct shall approve all administrative and polling place procedures. Such procedures shall take into account voter convenience, and ensure that the integrity of the election process is maintained and that the secrecy of the ballot is not violated.

Except in the event of a fire, flood or total loss of heat in a place fixed or established by any election authority pursuant to this Section as a polling place for an election, no election authority shall change the location of a polling place so established for any precinct after notice of the place of holding the election for that precinct has been given as required under Article 12 unless the election authority notifies all registered voters in the precinct of the change in location by first class mail in sufficient time for such notice to be received by the registered voters in the precinct at least one day prior to the date of the election.

The provisions of this Section apply to all precincts, including those where voting machines or electronic voting systems are used.

If, as a result of the redistricting of legislative, representative, or congressional districts following a decennial census, there exists a census block with only one voter that is the only census block in a precinct that is in a legislative, representative, or congressional district, then the county board, at any meeting of the county board, may change the precinct boundaries so that the census block is within a precinct that has more than one voter in the legislative, representative, or congressional district.

(10 ILCS 5/11-2) (from Ch. 46, par. 11-2)

Sec. 11-2. Election precincts. The County Board in each county, except in counties having a population of 3,000,000 inhabitants or over, shall, at its regular meeting in June or an adjourned meeting in July, divide its election precincts so that each precinct shall contain, as near as may be practicable, 1,200 registered voters. Insofar as is practicable, each precinct shall be situated within a single congressional, legislative and representative district and in not more than one County Board district and one municipal ward. In order to situate each precinct within a single district or ward, the County Board shall change the boundaries of election precincts after each decennial census as soon as is practicable following the completion of congressional and legislative redistricting, except that, in 2021, the county board shall change the boundaries at a regular or special meeting within 60 days after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 102nd General Assembly. In determining whether a division of precincts should be made, the county board may anticipate increased voter registration in any precinct in which there is in progress new construction of dwelling units which will be occupied by voters more than 30 days before the next election. Each district shall be composed of contiguous territory in as compact form as can be for the convenience of the electors voting therein. The several

county boards in establishing districts shall describe them by metes and bounds and number them. And so often thereafter as it shall appear by the number of votes cast at the general election held in November of any year, that any election district or undivided election precinct contains more than 1,200 registered voters, the County Board of the county in which the district or precinct may be, shall at its regular meeting in June, or an adjourned meeting in July next, after such November election, redivide or readjust such election district or election precinct, so that no district or election precinct shall contain more than the number of votes above specified. If for any reason the County Board fails in any year to redivide or readjust the election districts or election precinct, then the districts or precincts as then existing shall continue until the next regular June meeting of the County Board; at which regular June meeting or an adjourned meeting in July the County Board shall redivide or readjust the election districts or election precincts in manner as herein required. When at any meeting of the County Board any redivision, readjustment or change in name or number of election districts or election precincts is made by the County Board, the County Clerk shall immediately notify the State Board of Elections of such redivision, readjustment or change. The County Board in every case shall fix and establish the places for holding elections in its respective county and all elections shall be held at the places so fixed. The polling places shall in all cases be upon the ground floor in the front room, the entrance to which is in a highway or public street which is at least 40 feet wide, and is as near the center of the voting population of the precinct as is practicable, and for the convenience of the greatest number of electors to vote thereat; provided, however, where the County Board is unable to secure a suitable polling place within the boundaries of a precinct, it may select a polling place at the most conveniently located suitable place outside the precinct; but in no case shall an election be held in any room used or occupied as a saloon, dramshop, bowling alley or as a place of resort for idlers and disreputable persons, billiard hall or in any room connected therewith by doors or hallways. No person shall be permitted to vote at any election except at the polling place for the precinct in which he resides, except as otherwise provided in this Section or Article 19 of this Act. In counties having a population of 3,000,000 inhabitants or over the County Board shall divide its election precincts and shall fix and establish places for holding elections as hereinbefore provided during the month of January instead of at its regular meeting in June or at an adjourned meeting in July.

However, in the event that additional divisions of election precincts are indicated after a division made by the County Board in the month of January, such additional divisions may be made by the County Board in counties having a population of 3,000,000 inhabitants or over, at the regular meeting in June or at adjourned meeting in July. The county board of such county may divide or readjust precincts at any meeting of the county board when the voter registration in a precinct has increased beyond 1,800 registered voters and an election is scheduled before the next regular January or June meeting of the county board.

When in any city, village or incorporated town territory has been annexed thereto or disconnected therefrom, which annexation or disconnection becomes effective after election precincts or

election districts have been established as above provided in this Section, the clerk of the municipality shall inform the county clerk thereof as provided in Section 4-21, 5-28.1, or 6-31.1, whichever is applicable. In the event that a regular meeting of the County Board is to be held after such notification and before any election, the County Board shall, at its next regular meeting establish new election precinct lines in affected territory. In the event that no regular meeting of the County Board is to be held before such election the county clerk shall, within 5 days after being so informed, call a special meeting of the county board on a day fixed by him not more than 20 days thereafter for the purpose of establishing election precincts or election districts in the affected territory for the ensuing elections.

At any consolidated primary or consolidated election at which municipal officers are to be elected, and at any emergency referendum at which a public question relating to a municipality is to be voted on, notwithstanding any other provision of this Code, the election authority shall establish a polling place within such municipality, upon the request of the municipal council or board of trustees at least 60 days before the election and provided that the municipality provides a suitable polling place. To accomplish this purpose, the election authority may establish an election precinct constituting a single municipality of under 500 population for all elections, notwithstanding the minimum precinct size otherwise specified herein.

Notwithstanding the above, when there are no more than 50 registered voters in a precinct who are entitled to vote in a local government or school district election, the election authority having jurisdiction over the precinct is authorized to reassign such voters to one or more polling places in adjacent precincts, within or without the election authority's jurisdiction, for that election. For the purposes of such local government or school district election only, the votes of the reassigned voters shall be tallied and canvassed as votes from the precinct of the polling place to which such voters have been reassigned. The election authority having jurisdiction over the precinct shall approve all administrative and polling place procedures. Such procedures shall take into account voter convenience, and ensure that the integrity of the election process is maintained and that the secrecy of the ballot is not violated.

Except in the event of a fire, flood or total loss of heat in a place fixed or established by any county board or election authority pursuant to this Section as a polling place for an election, no election authority shall change the location of a polling place so established for any precinct after notice of the place of holding the election for that precinct has been given as required under Article 12 unless the election authority notifies all registered voters in the precinct of the change in location by first class mail in sufficient time for such notice to be received by the registered voters in the precinct at least one day prior to the date of the election.

The provisions of this Section apply to all precincts, including those where voting machines or electronic voting systems are used.

(10 ILCS 5/11-2.1) (from Ch. 46, par. 11-2.1)

Sec. 11-2.1. The county board in each county where any State soldiers' and sailors' home, or any national home for disabled volunteer soldiers is located, the inhabitants of which are entitled to vote, shall fix and establish the place or places for holding elections, at some convenient and comfortable place or places easy of access on the grounds and within the enclosures where such State soldiers' and sailors' home, or homes, or national home for disabled volunteer soldiers are located.

(10 ILCS 5/11-3) (from Ch. 46, par. 11-3)

Sec. 11-3. Election precincts.

(a) It shall be the duty of the Board of Commissioners established by Article 6 of this Act, within 2 months after its first organization, to divide the city, village or incorporated town which may adopt or is operating under Article 6, into election precincts, each of which shall be situated within a single congressional, legislative and representative district insofar as is practicable and in not more than one County Board district and one municipal ward; in order to situate each precinct within a single district or ward, the Board of Election Commissioners shall change the boundaries of election precincts after each decennial census as soon as is practicable following the completion of congressional and legislative redistricting and such precincts shall contain as nearly as practicable: (i) 1,200 registered voters if the precinct is located in a county with fewer than 3,000,000 inhabitants; or (ii) 1,800 registered voters if the precinct is located in a county with 3,000,000 or more inhabitants.

(b) Within 90 days after each presidential election, such board in a city with fewer than 500,000 inhabitants, village or incorporated town shall revise and rearrange such precincts on the basis of the votes cast at such election, making such precincts to contain, as near as practicable, 1,200 registered voters or 1,800 registered voters, as applicable. However, any apartment building in which more than 1,200 or 1,800 registered voters, as applicable, reside may be made a single precinct even though the vote in such precinct exceeds 1,200 or 1,800 registered voters, as applicable.

(c) Within 90 days after each presidential election, a board in a city with more than 500,000 inhabitants shall revise and rearrange such precincts on the basis of the votes cast at such election, making such precincts to contain, as near as practicable: (i) 1,200 registered voters if the precinct is located in a county with fewer than 3,000,000 inhabitants; or (ii) 1,800 registered voters if the precinct is located in a county with 3,000,000 or more inhabitants. However, any apartment building in which more than 1,200 registered voters or 1,800 registered voters, as applicable, reside may be made a single precinct even though the vote in such precinct exceeds 1,200 or 1,800 registered voters, as applicable.

(d) Immediately after the annexation of territory to the city, village or incorporated town becomes effective the Board of Election Commissioners shall revise and rearrange election precincts therein to include such annexed territory.

(e) Provided, however, that at any election where but one

candidate is nominated and is to be voted upon at any election held in any political subdivision of a city, village or incorporated town, the Board of Election Commissioners shall have the power in such political subdivision to determine the number of voting precincts to be established in such political subdivision at such election, without reference to the number of qualified voters therein. The precincts in each ward, village or incorporated town shall be numbered from one upwards, consecutively, with no omission.

(f) The provisions of this Section apply to all precincts, including those where voting machines or electronic voting systems are used.

(10 ILCS 5/11-4) (from Ch. 46, par. 11-4)

Sec. 11-4. It shall be the duty of the Board of Election Commissioners, established under Article 6 of this Act, to appoint the place of registry in each precinct for the first registration under Article 6 of this Act and the places for registry in subsequent registrations in the manner provided by such Article, and also the polling place in each precinct in such city, village or incorporated town which has adopted or is operating under said Article 6, and to give public notice thereof, and shall cause the same to be fitted up, warmed, lighted and cleaned, but in each election precinct and in each area for which a registration place is designated such place or places shall be in the most public, orderly and convenient portions thereof, and no building or part of a building shall be designated or used as a place of registry, or revision of registration, or as a polling place, in which spirituous or intoxicating liquor is sold. Provided, however, where the Board of Election Commissioners is unable to secure a suitable polling place within the boundaries of a precinct, it may select a polling place on a street immediately adjacent to and adjoining the precinct. Said Board of Election Commissioners may demand of the chief of police or the sheriff, to furnish officers of the law to attend during the progress of any registration, revision or election, at any place or places of registration, or any polling place, or places, designated by said commissioners, or to attend at any meeting of said commissioners. Said officers of the law, shall be furnished by said chief of police or sheriff and shall be stationed in the place or places of registration and polling place or places in such manner as said commissioners shall direct, and during said assignment shall be under the direction and control of the election commissioners.

Notwithstanding the above, when there are no more than 50 registered voters in a precinct who are entitled to vote in a local government or school district election, the election authority having jurisdiction over the precinct, is authorized to reassign such voters to one or more polling places in adjacent precincts, within or without the election authority's jurisdiction, for that election. For the purposes of such local government or school district election only, the votes of the reassigned voters shall be tallied and canvassed as votes from the precinct of the polling place to which such voters have been reassigned. The election authority having jurisdiction over the precinct shall approve all administrative and polling place procedures. Such procedures shall take into account voter convenience, and ensure that the integrity of the election

process is maintained and that the secrecy of the ballot is not violated.

Except in the event of a fire, flood or total loss of heat in a place fixed or established by the Board of Election Commissioners pursuant to this Section as a polling place for an election, no election authority shall change the location of a polling place so established for any precinct after notice of the place of holding the election for that precinct has been given as required under Article 12 unless the election authority notifies all registered voters in the precinct of the change in location by first class mail in sufficient time for such notice to be received by the registered voters in the precinct at least one day prior to the date of the election.

(10 ILCS 5/11-4.1) (from Ch. 46, par. 11-4.1)

Sec. 11-4.1. (a) In appointing polling places under this Article, the county board or board of election commissioners shall, insofar as they are convenient and available, use schools and other public buildings as polling places.

(b) Upon request of the county board or board of election commissioners, the proper agency of government (including school districts and units of local government) shall make a public building under its control available for use as a polling place on an election day and for a reasonably necessary time before and after election day, without charge. However, for the day of the election, a school district is encouraged to (i) close the school or (ii) hold a teachers institute on that day with students not in attendance.

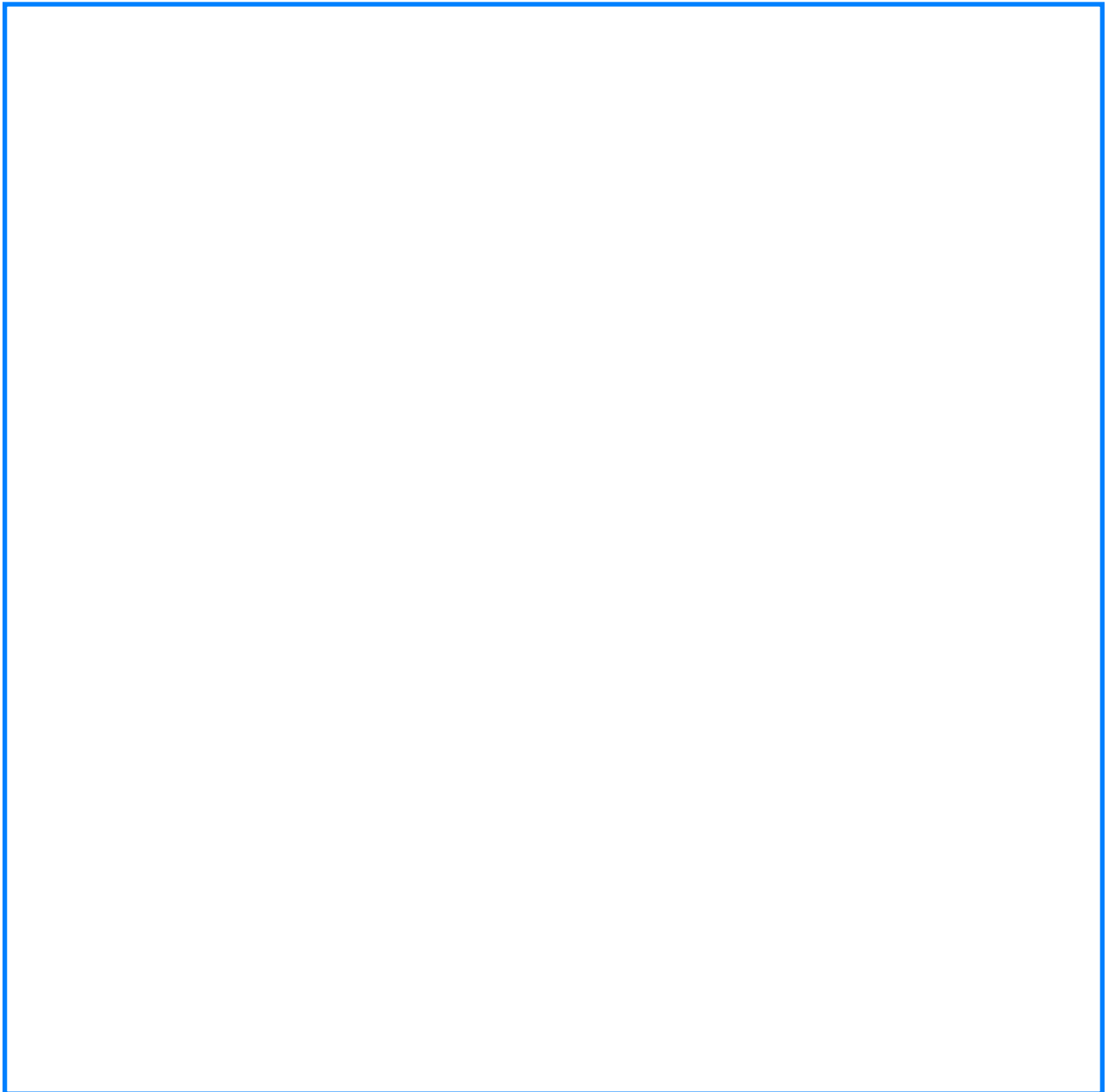

Election Board Enters Settlement Agreement with Justice Department on Accessible Polling Places

The Chicago Election Board has entered a settlement agreement after a 10-month joint effort with the U.S. Justice Department and Chicago-based Equip for Equality to evaluate the physical accessibility of polling places and Early Voting sites. The Board anticipates that several hundred precinct polling sites will need some forms of permanent or temporary modifications or will need to be re-located.

Using newer standards under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the Department of Justice began examining polling places and Early Voting sites during the March 2016 Primary Election. Similar examinations have been launched in other major cities around the country and in downstate Illinois.

Starting in June 2016, the Chicago Election Board staff began meeting with the Justice Department to review preliminary findings from the Primary. The Election Board teamed with a leading local disabilities-advocacy organization, Equip for Equality, to create a plan for a more comprehensive evaluation of the city's 2,069 precincts at the November 2016 General Election. This joint effort averted litigation.

"Equip for Equality worked closely with the Justice Department and the Board, and then recruited hundreds of attorneys from several corporations and law firms across Chicago to work pro bono on this project," said Election Board Chairwoman Marisel A. Hernandez. "These 'investigators' completed training and were supplied with the tools to measure sidewalk cracks, curb cuts, ramp angles, interior and exterior doorway widths, the amount of pressure needed to open doors and other aspects of sites that might have one or more barriers that could impede the access for a blind voter or a voter in a wheelchair."

Prior to the Settlement Agreement, the Board already had begun to work with public agencies whose sites may have been exempt from the newer rules for their main purposes, such as schools, parks, libraries or other facilities, or because they had an alternate entrance that was not used by voters on Election Day. However, to be used as polling places, some of these sites now will need modifications, such as adjustments to ramps or doors.

Under the terms of the Settlement Agreement, the Board will work with public and private property owners to bring as many polling places as possible into compliance starting with the March 2018 Primary election, with the goal of 100% ADA compliance by the November 2018 General Election.

This settlement agreement (the “Agreement”) is entered into as of April 11, 2017 (“Effective Date”), between the United States of America and the Board of Election Commissioners for the City of Chicago, Illinois (collectively, the “Parties”).

BACKGROUND

1. In February 2016, the United States Department of Justice (the “Department”) conducted a compliance review of polling places under the jurisdiction of the Board of Election Commissioners for the City of Chicago, Illinois (the “Board”) under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended (“ADA”), 42 U.S.C. §§ 12131–12134, and the Department’s Title-II-implementing regulation, 28 C.F.R. Part 35, to determine the accessibility of the Board’s polling places to persons with disabilities.

2. Pursuant to State law, it is the duty of the Board to divide the City of Chicago into election precincts, each of which shall be situated within a single congressional, legislative, and representative district insofar as is practicable, and in not more than one county board district and one municipal ward. Such precincts shall contain, as near as practicable, 400 voters. It is also the duty of the Board to appoint the polling place in each precinct. State law requires that all polling places shall be accessible to voters with disabilities, as determined by rule of the State Board of Elections.

3. The Board has in excess of 2,000 precincts for elections. One polling place site may house one or more polling divisions. In the spring of 2016, the Board had 1,452 polling place sites that housed 2,069 precincts.

4. In addition, it is the duty of the Board under State law to conduct “Early Voting” beginning the 40th day preceding Election Day in the Board’s central office and at other temporary and permanent Early Voting polling place locations throughout the City of Chicago beginning on the 15th day preceding Election Day. For the March 2016 Primary Election, the Board used 50 temporary and permanent Early Voting polling place locations at remote locations.

5. Pursuant to State law, the Board reviews the accessibility of each potential polling place. The Board then designates them as “accessible,” which indicates compliance with State guidelines, or “not fully accessible.” In order for a facility that has been designated “not fully accessible” to be used as a polling place in an election, the Board must apply for and receive an exemption from the State Board of Elections.

6. If an individual with a disability is assigned to a polling place that has been designated “not fully accessible,” he or she may obtain curbside voting assistance by submitting a written request to the Board by 5:00 pm the day before the election.

7. It is the Department's position that the exemption and curbside voting provisions are inconsistent with the ADA, which requires that jurisdictions select polling places that are or can be made accessible so that individuals with disabilities can vote on the same terms and with the same level of privacy afforded to others. 28 C.F.R. § 35.130(a). Nevertheless, in the rare circumstances that the Board is unable to select an accessible polling-place location that otherwise meets the requirements of this Agreement, then the Board may apply to the Department to use the program-accessibility provisions of Title II using the procedures set forth in Paragraph 26 of this Agreement. *See*, 28 C.F.R. § 35.150(b).

8. Based on polling-place reviews conducted during the March 2016 Primary Election, the Department concluded that many of the Board's "accessible" polling places as determined by rule of the State Board of Elections in fact contain, under the ADA, barriers to access for persons with mobility disabilities and persons who are blind or have other vision disabilities.

9. In response to the Department's initial findings, the Board engaged Equip for Equality ("EFE") to inspect over a thousand Chicago polling places not surveyed by the Department during the March 2016 election, and to serve as a consultant to assist the Board in identifying all ADA non-compliance issues relating to the Board's polling places. EFE, the federally mandated Protection and Advocacy system for people with disabilities in Illinois, is uniquely qualified to support the Board in this capacity, given its prior ADA polling-place experience in previous Illinois elections and pursuant to its statutory role under the Help America Vote Act.

10. In collaboration with the Board, EFE deployed over 200 staff and trained volunteers during the November 2016 General Election to review the accessibility of nearly all of the Board's polling places not previously inspected by the Department. Using a survey instrument modeled after the Department's ADA Checklist for Polling Places (June 2016), EFE found additional instances where polling-place locations were not accessible to voters with disabilities under the ADA.

11. The Board, a separate entity created under the laws of the State of Illinois, is a "public entity" within the meaning of the ADA, 42 U.S.C. § 12131(1), 28 C.F.R. § 35.104, and is therefore subject to Title II of the ADA, 42 U.S.C. §§ 12131–12134.

12. The Department is authorized under 28 C.F.R. Part 35, Subpart F, to determine the Board's compliance with Title II of the ADA and the Department's Title-II-implementing regulation, and to resolve the matter by informal resolution, such as through the terms of this Agreement. If informal resolution is not achieved, the Department is authorized to issue findings, and, where appropriate, to negotiate and secure voluntary compliance agreements. Furthermore, the Attorney General is authorized, under 42 U.S.C. § 12133, to bring a civil action enforcing Title II of the ADA should the Department fail to secure voluntary compliance pursuant to Subpart F.

TERMS OF SETTLEMENT

Obligations of the Board

A. Accessible Voting Program

13. Accessible polling places at accessible sites are and shall be the cornerstone of the Board's voting accessibility program. The Board has an obligation to provide an accessible voting program under federal law, including a program that is accessible to persons with mobility disabilities and persons who are blind or have other vision disabilities. 42 U.S.C. § 12132. The Board's Title-II obligations require it to select facilities to be used as polling places that do not exclude individuals with disabilities from or deny them the benefits of the polling place, or otherwise subject them to discrimination, 28 C.F.R. § 35.130(b)(4); and to administer its voting program in the most integrated setting appropriate to the needs of persons with disabilities, 28 C.F.R. § 35.130(d).

14. For all elections beginning with the March 2018 election, the Board will begin implementing the recommendations set forth in Paragraph 18 to ensure that by the November 6, 2018 election, each and every polling-place location is permanently or temporarily accessible during the voting period and will relocate inaccessible locations to an alternative accessible location pursuant to the process established by Paragraph 24 of this Agreement.

15. The Board shall maintain in operable working condition on Election Day and during Early Voting those features of facilities and equipment (including, but not limited to, permanent equipment such as lifts and elevators, and temporary equipment such as portable ramps, traffic cones, signs, wedges, and door stops) that are required to make polling places accessible to and usable by persons with disabilities. 28 C.F.R. § 35.133(a). If circumstances arise such that a polling place location that was previously accessible is no longer accessible because a feature of the facility or equipment is no longer operable, then the Board shall purchase new equipment or relocate the polling place to an alternative, accessible location in accordance with Paragraph 24 of this Agreement, notwithstanding any provision in State law.

16. Beginning with the March 2018 election, if off-street parking is provided to voters at a polling-place location, a minimum of one van-accessible parking space will be provided in a level area temporarily during the voting period through the placement of traffic cones and appropriate signage, or in some other equally effective manner.

17. The Board will cooperate fully with the Department's efforts to monitor compliance with this Agreement including, but not limited to, providing the Department with timely access to polling places (including during the early-voting period), ward maps, surveys, and other reasonably requested information.

18. The Board agrees that the following temporary measures will be implemented where necessary to make an otherwise inaccessible polling place temporarily accessible during the voting period. This list is not exhaustive; the Parties may agree to implement other, reasonable temporary measures.

- a. Portable ramps (including curb ramps) up to and including ramps six feet long, with side edge protection.

- b. Portable wedges or wedge ramps.
- c. Floor mats.
- d. Traffic Cones.
- e. Relocating furniture or other moveable barriers.
- f. Door stops.
- g. Propping open doors.
- h. Unlocking doors.
- i. Signage, including parking signage.
- j. Portable buzzers or doorbells.
- k. Removing astragals in doorways that are not a permanent part of the structure.

B. Survey, Compliance and Review of Polling Place Locations

19. In fulfilling the requirements of this Agreement, the Board will continue to engage EFE or some other third-party expert acceptable to both the Parties (either of which may be referred to herein as the "Third-Party Expert") as a consultant, and will enter into a separate agreement with the Third-Party Expert outlining the terms of this relationship. Under this separate agreement, it is anticipated that the Third-Party Expert will review all of EFE's polling place surveys from the November 2016 election and determine whether there are changes that can be implemented to make inaccessible polling places either temporarily or permanently accessible, or whether alternative locations need to be identified and designated as polling places; assist the Board with Election Judge training and material development; deploy Third-Party Expert staff and volunteers to survey polling places in the March 2018 election and subsequent elections to confirm that the remediations have been fully implemented; and deploy Third-Party Expert staff and volunteers during the March 2018 election and subsequent elections to address accessibility problems.

20. By June 1, 2017, the Third-Party Expert will review all polling place surveys from the November 2016 election and provide to the Board and the Department all of the November 2016 surveys. By September 15, 2017, the Third-Party Expert will provide its recommendations for implementation of temporary or permanent modifications for each polling place location found to be inaccessible. If no such remedies are available, the Third-Party Expert shall communicate this to the Board so that it can begin its search for an alternate site, as described in Paragraph 25.

21. Beginning with the effective date of this Agreement, the Board and/or the Third-Party Expert will survey the polling places not surveyed in 2016 by the Department or EFE that it intends to use in future elections, using the survey instrument referenced in Paragraph 34 of this Agreement. The Board will provide these surveys to the Department within 21 days of inspection, with all surveys to be completed by July 1, 2017.

22. If the Department concludes that a survey was conducted in error, then the Board will re-survey the portions in error. If the Department concludes that the Board or the Third-Party Expert has proposed a remedial provision that does not address the violation, then the Department will recommend a temporary remedial measure consistent with Paragraph 18 of this Agreement that the Board will implement in the next election. If the Board chooses not to or is unable to implement one or more of the recommended temporary remedial measures, it will relocate the inaccessible polling-place location to an accessible polling place-location selected pursuant to the process established by Paragraph 24 of this Agreement.

23. By the November 6, 2018 election, the Board will implement appropriate remedial provisions recommended pursuant to the 2016 surveys completed by the Department and EFE, and additional surveys conducted after the effective date of this Agreement, to make all polling-place locations temporarily accessible during the voting period, or will relocate inaccessible locations that cannot be made temporarily accessible to an alternative accessible location pursuant to the process established by Paragraph 24 of this Agreement.

24. After the effective date of this Agreement, the Board shall select new polling-place locations that are accessible to persons with disabilities. 42 U.S.C. § 12132. It shall be the Board's policy and practice to review each newly proposed polling-place location to determine whether it is accessible to persons with disabilities or could be made temporarily accessible during the voting period with the remedial measures provided for in Paragraph 18 of this Agreement, before the Board's selection of the location as a polling place. The Board shall use the survey instrument referenced in Paragraph 34 of this Agreement to make all future polling-place selections. If the Board ultimately determines that a newly proposed location is not accessible (as defined by the survey instrument) or cannot be made temporarily accessible during the voting period, then the Board will reject the location and continue searching until an accessible location or one that can be made temporarily accessible during the voting period can be found.

25. If the Board selects a new polling-place location, it will provide the Department notice of its decision-making within 21 days of the decision. The Board will provide the Department with copies of all surveys and photographs conducted pursuant to Paragraph 24 of this Agreement within 21 days of the decision to use the location as a polling place and prior to the location being used in an election. The Department's approval must be obtained prior to the location being used in an election. The Department's approval will be based exclusively on whether the proposed polling-place location satisfies the survey instrument referenced in Paragraph 34 of this Agreement.

26. If the Board finds that it cannot implement a recommendation regarding a specific polling-place location, the Board will immediately notify the Department and, upon request, meet and confer with the Department. If the issue cannot be resolved to the satisfaction of the Department, the Board will relocate the site to an alternative accessible location pursuant to the process established by Paragraph 24 of this Agreement.

27. Nothing in this Agreement precludes the Board from using "vote centers" if authorized by State law and compliant with all applicable federal statutes, provided that each vote center shall be accessible to voters with disabilities and the Board complies with its obligations set forth in Paragraphs 24 and 25 of this Agreement. For purposes of this

Agreement, a “vote center” means a polling place where a voter who resides in the city of Chicago may vote regardless of the precinct in which the voter resides.

C. Training

28. Prior to each election during the term of this Agreement, the Board will provide training to all in-precinct Election Coordinators on how to implement the temporary remedies (e.g., how to install ramps, or the placement of mats over (and not in front of) thresholds). As part of its training programs for Election Coordinators and Election Judges, the Board will provide training concerning temporary remedial measures, including: (a) why such measures are necessary, and; (b) the obligations of polling-place personnel not to interfere with, move, or otherwise change the temporary remedies in place at their assigned polling place location for the entire voting period.

D. Election Day Compliance Review

29. In the materials provided to each in-precinct Election Coordinator, the Board will include a checklist of the temporary measures to be implemented during the voting period at each polling place location where such measures are required. The checklist should contain a place for the Election Coordinator’s signature affirming that he or she kept the temporary remedies in place throughout each day of the voting period, from the opening of the polls to their closing, and should be returned to the Board along with other election materials. Copies of these checklists will be provided to the Department within 21 days of the election.

30. If a temporary remedy is not in place at any time during the voting period, the Election Coordinator should contact the person designated by the Executive Director of the Board to respond to accessibility problems encountered during the voting period. The designee shall then send Board personnel to fix the non-compliant implementation of the temporary measures when possible. Non-compliance shall be documented by both the in-precinct Election Coordinator for that polling place location and the designee. The Board will provide copies of this documentation to the Department within 21 days of the election.

31. If the Board does not properly implement the temporary remedial measures necessary at a particular polling place location during the voting period in an election, it will provide a detailed explanation to the Department for its failure to do so. If after providing this explanation and conferring with the Department the Board determines it will not be able to implement the temporary measures during the next election, it will no longer use the polling place location and shall relocate it to an accessible location or one that can be made temporarily accessible during the voting period pursuant to Paragraph 24 of this Agreement.

Obligations of the Department

32. In order to assist the Board with its obligations under the ADA, the Department has provided the Board with information from the Department’s March and November 2016 reviews of the Board’s polling place locations, including the violations found and recommendations for how to make each location temporarily accessible on Election Day, as applicable. The Board will obtain information from EFE’s November 2016 review through the procedure described in Paragraph 20.

33. Throughout the duration of this Agreement, the Department may conduct compliance review surveys or reviews of the Board's polling places in each election or at any time with reasonable notice.

34. The Department will provide assistance to the Board on devising and using a new survey instrument that will be based on the Department's ADA Checklist for Polling Places (June 2016) and will help assess whether a newly proposed polling-place location is or can be made temporarily accessible during the voting period. The survey instrument will include a requirement to include photographs and will also require the identification of appropriate remedial provisions, including the remedial provisions in Paragraph 18 of this Agreement. The survey instrument will be submitted to the Department for review and approval within 21 days of the effective date of this Agreement.

Enforcement Provisions

35. If at any time one of the Parties to this Agreement desires to modify any portion of this Agreement, it will promptly notify the other Party in writing, setting forth the facts and circumstances thought to justify modification and the substance of the proposed modification. An in-person meeting between the Parties will be held at the request of either Party. The Party receiving a request to modify the Agreement will not unreasonably delay notifying the requesting Party as to whether it will agree to the proposed modification. No modification will take effect unless and until the Parties memorialize the agreed-upon modification in writing.

36. In consideration of the mutual promises contained in this Agreement, good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged, and to avoid the costs, expenses, and uncertainty of protracted litigation, the Parties, intending to be legally bound, enter into this Agreement.

37. In consideration of, and consistent with the terms of this Agreement, the Department agrees to refrain from filing any civil suit related to the accessibility of Chicago's polling places for voters with disabilities until the day after four years from the effective date of this Agreement, except as provided in Paragraph 38 of this Agreement.

38. The Department may review compliance with this Agreement at any time. If the Department believes that the Board has failed to substantially comply in a timely manner with any requirement of this Agreement, the Department will so notify the Board in writing and attempt to resolve the issue in good faith. If the Department is unable to reach a satisfactory resolution of the issue within 30 days after providing notice to the Board and allowing the Board an opportunity to cure, the Department may institute a civil action in federal district court to enforce the terms of this Agreement or take other action to enforce Title II of the ADA.

39. Failure by the Department to enforce this entire Agreement or any other provision of it with regard to any deadline or any other provision of the Agreement will not be construed as a waiver of the Department's right to enforce other deadlines and provisions of this Agreement.

40. A copy of this document will be made available to any person by the Board or the Department on request.

41. This Agreement shall be applicable to and binding upon both Parties, their officers, agents, employees, and assigns.

42. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties on the matters raised herein, and no other statement, promise, or agreement, either written or oral, made by either Party or agents of either Party, that is not contained in this written Agreement will be enforceable. This Agreement does not purport to remedy any other disputes regarding the ADA or any other federal law, except to the extent they are related to the accessibility of the Board's polling places to voters with disabilities.

43. This Agreement will remain in effect for four years from the effective date.

44. The person signing for the Board represents that he or she is authorized to bind the Board to this Agreement.

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New Chicago elections map cutting precincts significantly ahead of November general election

Following a primary where problems popped up at polling places citywide, Chicago election officials are preparing to shrink the number of voting precincts by nearly 40% and are squeezing the cuts in just months before the contentious midterm election in November.

How the new precinct boundaries will affect where voters go on Election Day has not yet been determined. But the cuts will likely be noticeable as they are nearly twice the size of the city's precinct consolidation after the 2010 census.

Election officials have long complained that Chicago has too many precincts, and the new electoral map is designed to address rising costs of election operations as well as the changing behavior of voters who are increasingly voting early at central polling places or mailing in their ballots.

Officials with the Chicago Board of Election Commissioners said the recalibration is expected to save as much as \$2 million because the board will have fewer supply costs and won't need to hire as many election judges to work the polls on Election Day. A spokesman for the board also said the cuts will help election officials focus on ensuring that more precinct polling locations are compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act, work the city has been slow to address.

But the drastic reset also comes with some concerns because, while it remains unclear how many of the city's current 1,043 polling places will close, some voters are likely to find their polling locations changed for both the November general election and the following February when the mayoral and other city elections are held.

Ami Gandhi, a senior counsel for voting rights with the Chicago Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights, said she is worried about voter accessibility and said voters should have been more involved in the consolidation process.

Gandhi noted that in the June primary some voters were turned away from voting on Election Day after the [city announced weeks earlier that 73 precincts](#) would be without polling places and 56 polling places [opened late](#) primarily due to election judge shortages.

"We are very critical and concerned about any effort to reduce in-person polling place access, which is one of the effects of the closures that we saw in June, the closures and reduced number ... that's expected for the November elections and further, more drastic closures that could occur in the future, not just in Chicago, but in Illinois more broadly," Gandhi said.

One election worker, who said she has staffed a polling place in Humboldt Park every Election Day since 2014, said that while the Chicago Board of Elections generally does a good job getting the word out about changes, she thinks polling places could use a dedicated person this upcoming election to help redirect people who show up at the wrong site.

"If they don't stay on top of this before they do it to let people know that (their polling place) might be changing, it will be a mess," said Eileen Black, who hadn't heard of the changes to the map.

But Chicago Board of Elections spokesman Max Bever said the board is going to work to limit the confusion, as voters can expect to receive mailers with their new precinct and polling places assignments.

"So this does mean that voters will not only have a new precinct, they will likely have a new polling place location ahead of November," Bever said.

While Bever said the board is hoping to keep as many existing polling places open as possible, the moves follow a steady decrease in the number of polling places across the city that have been open on Election Day. In the 2018 primary election, for instance, there were 1,449 polling places citywide. That number decreased by about 400 by this June's primary.

Since 2012, there have been 2,069 precincts. Under the cuts that are about to occur, the number of precincts citywide will drop to 1,290, officials say.

With the new map finalized, the board has just over two months to find new

polling place locations or confirm existing ones. The board expects the process to be completed by the end of September, brushing up against the start of early voting on Sept. 29.

The precinct reductions were included in legislation that passed last year through the Illinois General Assembly and was signed into law in November by Democratic Gov. J.B. Pritzker. The precinct provisions raised the limit of voters per precinct from 800 to 1,800 in Cook County and to 1,200 for every other county in the state. Many of the other counties in Illinois already have implemented the changes.

Chicago is a bit late to the game because city election officials had to wait for city ward boundaries to be drawn, a process that took months longer than expected due to a [controversial remapping process](#).

The Chicago Board of Elections proposed ward precinct maps and then got feedback from aldermen. Among the potential problems some council members spotted were proposed precincts that were split by major streets, waterways or thoroughfares, precinct lines that didn't align with neighborhood boundaries or proposed polling places that were too far from senior housing.

As is often the case in Chicago, many aldermen pushed back against the proposal to cut the service their constituents would receive, and the board agreed in several cases to restore precincts it had originally planned to eliminate.

Citywide, the reduction will mean an average of 1,165 voters will be located within each precinct, compared with the 500 to 800 voters per precinct Chicago has historically had.

Ald. Matt O'Shea, 19th, said he met with board officials three times to revise the new precinct map. According to documents obtained by the Tribune through a public records request, the board initially proposed 28 precincts for the Southwest Side ward, a 50% reduction from the 57 the ward has had for a decade. Both sides finally settled on the ward having 36 precincts.

O'Shea said the compromise was reached because, while he understood the logistical need for fewer precincts, he was concerned a significant decrease would limit voter access.

"This isn't an easy needle to thread," he said. "If they have to drive 2 miles to vote, that's voter suppression. If they have to wait two hours in line, that's voter

suppression.”

With the new citywide map, the three wards that will see the greatest reduction in precincts will be the 34th Ward, which is currently on the Far South Side but is being moved under the new ward map to the downtown, West Loop and South Loop neighborhoods; the 14th Ward on the Southwest Side; and the 24th Ward on the West Side.

Each of those wards has idiosyncrasies tied to its council representative.

In the 34th, Ald. Carrie Austin has been [under federal indictment for bribery charges](#) and has said she’s not running for reelection. In the 14th, Ald. Ed Burke, the longest-serving alderman in Chicago history, is scheduled to go on [trial for federal corruption next year](#) and hasn’t announced whether he’s running for reelection. And in the 24th Ward, Ald. Monique Scott, was just named by Mayor Lori Lightfoot to replace her brother [Michael Scott](#), who stepped down to take a job in the private sector.

The 9th Ward, which encompasses mostly the Pullman neighborhood on the Far South Side, used to be in the top five in terms of the number of precincts.

Although its alderman, Anthony Beale, was one of seven aldermen [who voted against the new ward map](#), Beale said he thinks the move to reduce precincts is smart and cost-effective because more voters are casting ballots early.

Following several extensive conversations with board officials, Beale said he is “confident” the number of precincts going forward is right.

“Whatever problems we have, we want to air them out in a non-aldermanic election,” Beale said.

Still, residents remain concerned.

Diana Thomas, 59, has lived on the same block in the 34th Ward for decades and prefers to vote in person. But when she showed up this past June shortly before the polls closed, she found herself in the wrong place. Her polling place had changed in 2020, and she said the security guard at the Wentworth Commons apartment building, where she voted for years prior, couldn’t help her. Without time or a way to find the right polling place, Thomas wasn’t able to cast a ballot in the primary.

With the 34th Ward gearing up for a big change, Thomas said she is concerned about her neighbors finding their way.

"I think a lot of people are going to get caught up in the change and they're not gonna vote. I don't think this being handled right," she said. "There are a lot of elderly people in 34th Ward. ... What about them?"

While the board is trying to calm fears by saying it will try to close as few precinct polling places as possible this November, spokesman Bever said the board is also hopeful the precinct cuts will help with another issue: increasing the percentage of polling places that are ADA accessible.

In 2017, the board entered into a settlement agreement with the U.S. Department of Justice to make [all polling places accessible to disabled voters](#) by the 2018 general election. The agreement was amended in 2019 to move the target date to the upcoming 2022 general election, but the board does not anticipate it will meet the goal and expects that the agreement will need to be amended again.

A Tribune analysis shows that fewer than 20% of the polling places in June's primary were ADA compliant.

Over the next few election cycles, Bever said, the board will focus on moving

polling places to ADA-compliant locations.

“The delays caused by COVID-19 in this project have been a major roadblock over the past few years,” Bever wrote in a statement to the Tribune.

“Additionally, there have been continued budgeting complications for the agencies that own and operate non-compliant public buildings.”

All of Chicago’s precincts have lowered booths to accommodate voters in wheelchairs, which also became a statewide law last November, Chicago Board of Elections general counsel Adam Lasker said during a recent board meeting.

All of the 51 early voting centers, which will also be open on Election Day, are ADA compliant.

Outside of Chicago, some county government officials have pivoted to follow the new law.

In suburban Cook County, the county clerk’s office implemented its precinct consolidation in December and reduced the total number of precincts by 10%, said clerk spokeswoman Sally Daly. Daly said the consolidation occurred within the existing polling places and that no polling places changed as a result.

The Illinois Association of County Clerks and Records lobbied for the legislation, according to Julie Bliss, an official with the group and the clerk and recorder in Boone County.

And even though the legislation was aimed at decreasing the number of precincts, some counties actually saw the precinct number increase because populations in those counties have spiked over the past decade. Indeed, Lake, Kane and McHenry counties all saw an increase in precincts.

While some counties have moved quickly to implement a new map, others, such as Sangamon County, where Springfield is located, have decided to take more time.

“Instead of a very rushed timeline with the preparations needed for the late June primary, we decided to hold the reapportionment process for 2023,” said Sangamon County Clerk Don Gray. “We try to be as consistent as possible in election administration so as to not confuse voters and not disrupt the consistency of elections.”

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
