UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR AN ORDER HOLDING IN ABEYANCE PROCEEDINGS REGARDING ATTORNEYS' FEES AND EXPENSES

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 54(d) and Western District of Texas Local Rule CV-54, Plaintiffs respectfully move for entry of an order holding in abeyance proceedings regarding the award of attorneys' fees and costs in this action until 14 days after the mandate issues after all appeals are resolved. To support this motion, Plaintiffs state:

1. On August 2, 2022, this Court issued its Mandatory Injunction and Final Judgment (hereinafter "August 2 Order") declaring that Defendant Scott's refusal to release the requested voter-registration records (hereinafter "Records") upon Plaintiffs' requests violates the National Voter Registration Act and ordering Defendant Scott to provide Plaintiffs with the Records within 14 days of the August 2 Order. This Court further ordered that Plaintiffs should recover their costs

of court from Defendant Scott.

2. Pursuant to Rule 54(d), a claim for attorneys' fees and related expenses must be

filed no later than fourteen days after the entry of judgment "[u]nless . . . a court order provides

otherwise." Accordingly, Plaintiffs' application for attorney's fees and related expenses pursuant

to the Court's August 2 Order is due on August 16, 2022 and the time for Plaintiffs to file an

application for attorney's fees has not yet expired.

3. On August 4, 2022 Defendant Scott filed a notice of appeal. Plaintiffs will incur

additional attorneys' fees and expenses as they oppose the State's appeal. Plaintiffs believe that

litigating attorney's fees and costs in one proceeding at the end of the case, instead of piecemeal

in multiple proceedings, is more efficient and conserves this Court's time and resources. Plaintiffs

conferred, through counsel, with Defendants, who do not oppose this motion.

4. Therefore, Plaintiffs respectfully request that this Court order that Plaintiffs'

motion for attorneys' fees and costs be due 14 days after the mandate issues after all appeals are

resolved.

No prior extensions have been sought or granted. 5.

WHEREFORE, Plaintiffs requests that this Court order that Plaintiffs' motion for the

award of attorneys' fees and costs be due 14 days after the mandate issues after all appeals are

resolved.
