A BILL

- To amend the Help America Vote Act of 2002 to allow individuals to vote in an election for Federal office during an early voting period which occurs prior to the date of the election, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Early Voting Act".

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1 SEC. 2. EARLY VOTING.

2 (a) REQUIREMENTS.—Subtitle A of title III of the
3 Help America Vote Act of 2002 (52 U.S.C. 21081 et seq.)
4 is amended—

5 (1) by redesignating sections 304 and 305 as
6 sections 305 and 306; and

7 (2) by inserting after section 303 the following8 new section:

9 "SEC. 304. EARLY VOTING.

10 "(a) REQUIRING VOTING PRIOR TO DATE OF ELEC-11 TION.—Each State shall allow individuals to vote in an 12 election for Federal office during an early voting period 13 which occurs prior to the date of the election, in a manner 14 that allows the individual to receive, complete, and cast 15 their ballot in-person.

16 "(b) MINIMUM EARLY VOTING REQUIREMENTS.—

17 "(1) IN GENERAL.—

18 "(A) LENGTH OF PERIOD.—The early vot-19 ing period required under this subsection with 20 respect to an election shall consist of a period 21 of consecutive days (including weekends) which 22 begins on the 15th day before the date of the 23 election (or, at the option of the State, on a day 24 prior to the 15th day before the date of the 25 election) and ends no earlier than the second 26 day before the date of the election.

1	"(B) HOURS FOR EARLY VOTING.—Each
2	polling place which allows voting during an
3	early voting period under subparagraph (A)
4	shall—
5	"(i) allow such voting for no less than
6	10 hours on each day during the period;
7	"(ii) have uniform hours each day for
8	which such voting occurs; and
9	"(iii) allow such voting to be held for
10	some period of time prior to 9:00 a.m
11	(local time) and some period of time after
12	5:00 p.m. (local time).
13	"(2) Requirements for vote-by-mail juris-
14	DICTIONS.—In the case of a jurisdiction that sends
15	every registered voter a ballot by mail—
16	"(A) paragraph (1) shall not apply;
17	"(B) such jurisdiction shall allow eligible
18	individuals to vote during an early voting period
19	that ensures voters are provided the greatest
20	opportunity to cast ballots ahead of election day
21	and which includes at least one consecutive Sat-
22	urday and Sunday; and
23	"(C) each polling place which allows voting
24	during an early voting period under subpara-
25	graph (B) shall allow such voting—

1	"(i) during the election office's reg-
2	ular business hours; and
3	"(ii) for a period of not less than 8
4	hours on Saturdays and Sundays included
5	in the early voting period.
6	"(3) Requirements for small jurisdic-
7	TIONS.—
8	"(A) IN GENERAL.—In the case of a juris-
9	diction described in subparagraph (B), para-
10	graph (1)(B) shall not apply so long as all eligi-
11	ble individuals in the jurisdiction have the op-
12	portunity to vote—
13	"(i) at each polling place which allows
14	voting during the early voting period de-
15	scribed in paragraph (1)(A)—
16	"(I) during the election office's
17	regular business hours; and
18	"(II) for a period of not less than
19	8 hours on at least one Saturday and
20	at least one Sunday included in the
21	early voting period; or
22	"(ii) at one or more polling places in
23	the county in which such jurisdiction is lo-
24	cated that allows voting during the early
25	voting period described in paragraph

1	(1)(A) in accordance with the requirements
2	under paragraph (1)(B).
3	"(B) JURISDICTION DESCRIBED.—A juris-
4	diction is described in this subparagraph if such
5	jurisdiction—
6	"(i) had less than 3,000 registered
7	voters at the time of the most recent prior
8	election for Federal office; and
9	"(ii) consists of a geographic area
10	that is smaller than the jurisdiction of the
11	county in which such jurisdiction is lo-
12	cated.
13	"(4) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in
14	this subsection shall be construed—
15	"(A) to limit the availability of additional
16	temporary voting sites which provide voters
17	more opportunities to cast their ballots but
18	which do not meet the requirements of this sub-
19	section;
20	"(B) to limit a polling place from being
21	open for additional hours outside of the uniform
22	hours set for the polling location on any day of
23	the early voting period; or

"(C) to limit a State or jurisdiction from
 offering early voting on the Monday before elec tion day.

4 "(c) Location of Polling Places.—

5 **((1)** PROXIMITY ТО PUBLIC TRANSPOR-6 TATION.—To the greatest extent practicable, each 7 State and jurisdiction shall ensure that each polling 8 place which allows voting during an early voting pe-9 riod under subsection (b) is located within walking 10 distance of a stop on a public transportation route. 11 "(2) AVAILABILITY IN RURAL AREAS.—In the 12 case of a jurisdiction that includes a rural area, the 13 State or jurisdiction shall—

14 "(A) ensure that polling places which allow
15 voting during an early voting period under sub16 section (b) will be located in such rural areas;
17 and

"(B) ensure that such polling places are located in communities which will provide the
greatest opportunity for residents of rural areas
to vote during the early voting period.

"(3) COLLEGE CAMPUSES.—In the case of a jurisdiction that includes an institution of higher education, the State or jurisdiction shall—

1 "(A) ensure that an appropriate number 2 (not less than one) of polling places which allow voting during the early voting period under sub-3 4 section (b) will be located on each branch cam-5 pus of the institution of higher education; and 6 "(B) ensure that such polling places pro-7 vide the greatest opportunity for residents of 8 the jurisdiction to vote.

9 "(d) STANDARDS.—Not later than June 30, 2024, 10 the Commission shall issue voluntary standards for the ad-11 ministration of voting during voting periods which occur 12 prior to the date of a Federal election. Subject to sub-13 section (c), such voluntary standards shall include the 14 nondiscriminatory geographic placement of polling places 15 at which such voting occurs.

16 "(e) BALLOT PROCESSING AND SCANNING REQUIRE17 MENTS.—

18 "(1) IN GENERAL.—Each State or jurisdiction 19 shall begin processing and scanning ballots cast dur-20 ing in-person early voting for tabulation not later 21 than the date that is 14 days prior to the date of 22 the election involved, except that a State or jurisdic-23 tion may begin processing and scanning ballots cast 24 during in-person early voting for tabulation after 25 such date if the date on which the State or jurisdic-

tion begins such processing and scanning ensures, to
 the greatest extent practical, that ballots cast before
 the date of the election are processed and scanned
 before the date of the election.

5 "(2) LIMITATION.—Nothing in this subsection
6 shall be construed—

"(A) to permit a State or jurisdiction to
tabulate ballots in an election before the closing
of the polls on the date of the election unless
such tabulation is a necessary component of
preprocessing in the State or jurisdiction and is
performed in accordance with existing State
law; or

14 "(B) to permit an official to make public
15 any results of tabulation and processing before
16 the closing of the polls on the date of the elec17 tion.

18 "(f) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall apply
19 with respect to the regularly scheduled general election for
20 Federal office held in November 2024 and each succeeding
21 election for Federal office.".

(b) CONFORMING AMENDMENT RELATING TO
ISSUANCE OF VOLUNTARY GUIDANCE BY ELECTION ASSISTANCE COMMISSION.—Section 311(b) of such Act (52
U.S.C. 21101(b)) is amended—

(1) by striking "and" at the end of paragraph
 (2);

3 (2) by striking the period at the end of para4 graph (3) and inserting "; and"; and

5 (3) by adding at the end the following new6 paragraph:

7 "(4) in the case of the recommendations with
8 respect to section 304, June 30, 2024.".

9 (c) CONFORMING AMENDMENT RELATING TO EN-10 FORCEMENT.—Section 401 of such Act (52 U.S.C. 21111) 11 is amended by striking "and 303" and inserting "303, and 12 304".

13 (d) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents14 of such Act is amended—

(1) by redesignating the items relating to sections 304 and 305 as relating to sections 305 and
306; and

18 (2) by inserting after the item relating to sec-19 tion 303 the following new item:

"Sec. 304. Early voting.".
