In support thereof, Petitioner states as follows:

- Petitioner is the Judge of Probate of St. Clair County and the chief election official of St. Clair County pursuant to Code of Ala. 17-1-3(b).
- The affected polling places are located in both the Northern and Southern Divisions of the St. Clair County, Circuit Court and include:

3. Upon opening the sealed ballots at the opening of the polls at the above-listed polling places

it was discovered that certain printed ballots were printed in error by failing to include

certain ballot provisions, namely certain proposed Alabama Constitutional Amendments.

4. Code of Ala. § 17-10-2(a) anticipates potential court orders to extend poll closing

times and provides that:

A voter shall be required to cast a provisional ballot when: . . .

(4) A federal or state court order extends the time for closing the polls beyond that established by state law and the individual votes during the extended period of time.

Notwithstanding any other provision of state law, where provisional ballots are cast pursuant to a federal or state court order extending the time for closing the polls

beyond that established by state law, the provisional ballots shall be segregated from other provisional ballots into a separate sealed container for such purpose and

shall be counted, tabulated, and canvassed only pursuant to the order of a court

having proper jurisdiction.

5. In the interest of justice and equity, and to ensure adequate citizen voting opportunity on a

ballot that includes the proper Alabama Constitutional Amendments language at the above-

listed polling places, your Petitioner respectfully requests this Court extend the time for

closing said polling places to allow voters to cast provisional ballots pursuant to Code of

Ala. § 17-10-1 et. seq.

WHEREFORE, PREMISES CONSIDERED, Petitioner, Andrew Weathington, Judge of

Probate of St. Clair County, Alabama, petitions this honorable Court to enter an Order extending

the time for closing the polls beyond that established by Code of Ala. § 17-9-6 for the above-listed

polling places within St. Clair County, Alabama and provide Petitioner with any further, different

relief to which he may be entitled.
