



<sup>1</sup> Under the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania’s Election Code, provisional ballots shall not be counted if the individual voter has not signed the ballot envelope under both clauses (2) and (3) of the envelope or if the provisional ballot in not placed in the secrecy envelope. 25 P.S. § 3050(a.4)(5)(ii).

The Appellants have not sufficiently demonstrated that this provision of the Election Code violates the Pennsylvania Constitution, United States Constitution, or in in conflict with the Help America Vote Act, 52 U.S.C. § 21082.
