**LEAGUE AND LULAC PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR PARTIAL SUMMARY
JUDGMENT**

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 56 and Local Civil Rule 7(h), Plaintiffs League of Women Voters Education Fund, League of Women Voters of the United States, League of Women Voters of Arizona, Hispanic Federation, National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, OCA-Asian Pacific American Advocates, and Asian and Pacific Islander American Vote (“League Plaintiffs”) and Plaintiffs League of United Latin American Citizens, Secure Families Initiative, and Arizona Students’ Association (“LULAC Plaintiffs”) (collectively “Nonpartisan Plaintiffs”) respectfully move for partial summary judgment against Defendants Donald J. Trump (in his official capacity as President of the United States), Executive Office of the President, United States Election Assistance Commission (“EAC”), Donald L. Palmer (in his official capacity as Chairman and a Commissioner of the EAC), Thomas Hicks (in his official capacity as Vice Chair and a Commissioner of the EAC), Christy McCormick and Benjamin W. Hovland (in their official capacities as Commissioners of the EAC), and Brianna Schletz (in her official capacity as Executive Director of the EAC) (“Defendants”).¹ Nonpartisan Plaintiffs respectfully move for declaratory relief against all Defendants, and move to permanently enjoin Defendants EAC, Palmer, Hicks, McCormick, Hovland, and Schletz from implementing Section 2(a) of President Trump’s March 25, 2025 Executive Order 14,248.

As set forth in the accompanying Memorandum in Support of Partial Summary Judgment, Nonpartisan Plaintiffs are entitled to summary judgment on their claims that Section 2(a) of President Trump’s March 25, 2025, Executive Order No. 14248 is unconstitutional because there is no genuine dispute as to any material fact and Nonpartisan Plaintiffs are entitled to judgment as a matter of law.

The grounds for this Motion are fully set forth in the accompanying Memorandum in Support. A Statement of Undisputed Material Facts, Plaintiffs’ Exhibits, and a Proposed Order are filed herewith.

¹ The League Plaintiffs challenge only Section 2(a) and therefore respectfully request that the Court enter final judgment in their favor.
