JOINT STIPULATION OF FACTS AND EXHIBITS

The Parties stipulate to the admission of the following facts and exhibits. By stipulating to these facts and exhibits, the Parties do not concede that such facts and exhibits are relevant or necessary for the Court to resolve this matter. The Parties have agreed not to object to the entry of these facts and exhibits into the record, reserving objections to relevance only. Matters contained in exhibits but not expressly discussed in a stipulation are part of the record and may be cited by the Parties.

1. The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People Missouri State Conference is a membership organization formed and operated under the laws of Missouri.

2. Patricia A. Jones is a Missouri citizen, resident of Jackson County, a taxpayer, and qualified voter in the State of Missouri.

3. Traci L. Wilson-Kleekamp is a Missouri citizen, resident of Boone County,

a taxpayer, and qualified voter in the State of Missouri.

4. Michael Kehoe is the Governor of Missouri and is responsible for performing all executive functions required or allowed by the Missouri Constitution.

5. Catherine Hanaway is the Attorney General of Missouri and is responsible for defending the State of Missouri in any legal challenges to congressional districts designated by the General Assembly.

6. Cindy O'Laughlin is the President Pro Tem of the Missouri Senate and is responsible for convening the Senate and setting its schedule.

7. Jon Patterson is the Speaker of the Missouri House of Representatives and is responsible for convening the House and setting its schedule.

8. The State of Missouri enforces the Statutes and Constitution of Missouri and will be responsible for the implementation of legislation passed during the extraordinary session.

9. On August 29, 2025, Governor Mike Kehoe issued a Proclamation and associated Press Release convening the Missouri General Assembly into an extraordinary session pursuant to Article IV Section 9.

10. The Missouri General Assembly truly agreed and finally passed House Joint Resolution 3 (2025-2) on September 12, 2025.

11. On September 12, 2025, House Joint Resolution 3 (2025-2) was delivered to the Missouri Secretary of State.

12. The Missouri General Assembly truly agreed and finally passed House Bill 1 (2025-2) on September 12, 2025.

13. House Bill 1 is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

14. On September 28, 2025, Governor Mike Kehoe signed House Bill 1 (2025-2).

15. Every ten years, the United States Census Bureau conducts a census to determine the relevant population for federal congressional apportionment.

16. In 2020, the United States Census Bureau conducted the decennial census.

17. On August 12, 2021, the United States Census Bureau certified the census data to the Governor of Missouri.

18. Thereafter, the General Assembly drew congressional districts based on the 2020 census and passed such districts in House Bill 2909 (2022).

19. House Bill 2909 (2022) is attached hereto as Exhibit B.

20. The United States Census Bureau has not conducted a census since the 2020 census.

21. No census has been certified to the Governor of Missouri since the

certification of the 2020 census occurred on August 12, 2021.

22. No lawsuits challenging House Bill 2909 (2022) have succeeded in invalidating said districts.
